Our breakfast program is running every morning starting at 7:55 am. It contributes to a nutritional start of the day for many of our students and also provides a fun social environment for the students before school. All students are welcome! We do have some children coming to school before 7:55am. There is no supervision prior to 7:55am so students are not allowed on school property during this time without adult supervision.

Reading continues to be part of Sutton Public School's Improvement Plan. Children need a friend or adult to read and discuss books with, and to share their thinking and learning. "How can a parent select just the right book to capture a child's interest? Even if you are not familiar with children's books, you know more about your child than anyone else does. You have the best possible chance to find a good fit. A boy who dislikes reading may become engrossed in a book about his favourite athlete. A girl who rarely finishes books may discover a series that makes her feel as if she's found new friends. Knowing your children's interests helps you to tell when a book is 'just right.' Don't worry if you can't find the perfect book right away. Make a list of your child's interests and then go to the library. If possible, select books you're also interested in, because enthusiasm is contagious. If you and your child aren't enjoying a book you've selected, don't be afraid to try something else." Safety week activities occurred this past week in classrooms which highlighted safety at home, at school, and in the community. For the past eleven years, YRDSB Safety Awareness Week has been observed annually, during the month of September. Safety Awareness also includes the opportunity to conduct a required "lockdown" drill and "Hold-And Secure" drill in our school. We had a lockdown practice last Wednesday, October 2nd where students remained quiet and everyone remained out of sight. A "Lockdown" is a school emergency response to the presence or suspected presence of an armed intruder or other similar violent threat within the school. The purpose of a lockdown is to make the school building appear empty.

Safety at home, at school, and in the community is a focus at Sutton PS especially during Safety Week, Sept. 30 to Oct. 4. All YRDSB schools will participate in a variety of activities related to student safety, under an umbrella theme of "Safety Awareness Week". Among these activities, all schools will carry out an exercise to test their response to 'Lockdown' and 'Fire Drill' conditions in the school. Classrooms will discuss the expectations in the health documents addressing personal safety and injury prevention.

#### Re: Student Busing Eligibility

School

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

## **Search and Seizure**

In order to promote safety at school, it is important to remind all school community members of the right for school administrators to search school property, such as lockers and desks, without notice or permission of any person. Further, police may also, from time to time, be invited to conduct a search of school property; such searches may be conducted without notice to, or permission of, any member of the school community other than the principal. Such instances as noted above shall be documented accordingly.

## **Student Safety**

Students who ride bicycles, scooters or skateboards to school must:

- Wear a helmet—for bikes, it is the law!
- Keep the bicycle locked on the bicycle rack
- Walk the bicycle, scooter or skateboard on and off school property

## Kiss & Ride Drop Off Zone



### EQAO Results 2012-2013

Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics for the primary division (Grades 1-3) and junior division (Grades 4-6).



This graph provides a summary of Sutton Public School's performance related to literacy and mathematics skills measured by the EQAO assessments. The test was written by last year's grade 3 and grade 6 students last May 2013. The summary can be used to identify strengths and weaknesses in the reading, writing and mathematics skills that students are expected to develop by the end of the primary and junior divisions, as outlined in Ontario curriculum documents.

As a school, we interpret our school's strengths and weaknesses and engage in a discussion about what percentage would suggest a strength in our students. We then identify factors that might have contributed to a strength in specific areas (e.g., teaching strategies, content coverage, school focus, new learning resources). We similarly discuss with staff what percentage would suggest an area in need of improvement in our students. We identify factors that might have contributed to the need for improvement in specific areas (e.g., lack of direct teaching, poor student attendance).

The EQAO data will be shared with parents during October's School Council meeting.
