Remember that classes may change at the end of September. Families are still registering, and we may have to shuffle students and grades as we ensure we meet the cap of 20 students in primary classes. We appreciate your patience as we work through our class placements. We do have a number of combined classes which are composed of students from two or more adjacent grades who are grouped with one teacher for instruction. *"In all classrooms, no matter how they are organized, teachers need to provide for the individual needs of students. To achieve this, they use a variety of methods on a daily basis to assess the needs of each student and then adjust the focus of instruction for skill development accordingly. In all classrooms, there is a range of students, and a teacher's goal to meet the needs of all learners remains the same regardless of classroom organization. Also, the focus of instruction for all subjects is on helping students to advance regardless of age, grade, or current level of performance" (Combined Grades - Ministry of Education, Ontario).*

At Sutton PS we will be continuing our work on a respectful workplace and learning environment. This means "that we create and maintain a healthy and productive working and learning environment that fosters respect for and is supportive of the dignity, self-esteem and fair treatment of everyone taking part in its activities." Respect is the character trait this month which links to our school and community focus of respectful workplace and learning environment. Respect plays an important role in a school. We need to take a person's feelings, needs, and thoughts into consideration as we build relationships within the school community. No Parking in the Kiss and Ride Zone

Although signage stating the area is a Kiss and Ride Zone, cars are parking to drop off or pick up students. The driveways are fire and evacuation routes. We need to keep the flow of traffic moving through our parking lot and keep our students and community members safe. Please remember to enter the parking lot staying to the right. Drop off your child(ren) in the KISS and RIDE zone and continue around to exit. If you are coming into the school or need to get out of your car to help your child, please follow the flow of traffic and park in a designated parking spot. Parents are having difficulty getting into the parking lot and are caught waiting on the road for cars to exit. Please don't park and get out of your car in the Kiss and Ride. Another way to help with the traffic flow is to walk your child to school. Daily physical exercise for your child before school starts gets them ready and alert for learning.

School Security and Visitors in the School

The school doors are locked during the school day. Please ring the bell for entrance and check in at the office when you enter the school. The doors will be open before school to allow staff and students to enter and after school to allow families to enter the day care. If you are volunteering or attending a special event in the school, please sign in the office and wear a visitor badge. If you would like to see a teacher, check into the office, and the teacher will be called to the office to meet you. Please do not walk down the hallway to your child's class because you are a stranger to the other children.
