From The Office

Welcome back students and parents. We hope you had a wonderful summer with family and friends. It is an exciting time of year as we begin our learning routines and work together on student success. A daily reading and homework routine will help your child succeed this year. Please contact your child's teacher to find out what they are learning in class so you can support at home. Our Meet the Teacher night is on September 19th from 5:30 to 7:00pm. The school will be open at 5:30 and teachers will be in their classrooms from 6:00 to 7:00pm. Make sure you drop by to discuss plans for the upcoming year and how you can help your child at home. Arrange the best way for the teacher to communicate with you regarding your child's progress this year.

The team is very skilled at keeping the school a place to be proud of all year long and everyone appreciates their pride in our school environment. Also thank you to Ms. Kirton and Ms. McAndrew for their work during the last couple of weeks to set up classrooms and programs.

Remember that classes may change until the end of September. Families are still registering and we may have to shuffle students and grades the teachers teach as we ensure we meet the cap of 20 students in primary classes. We appreciate your patience as we work through our class placements. We do have a number of combined classes which are composed of students from two or more adjacent grades who are grouped with one teacher for instruction. "In all classrooms, no matter how they are organized, teachers need to provide for the individual needs of students. To achieve this, they use a variety of methods on a daily basis to asses the needs of each student, and then adjust the focus of instruction for skill development accordingly. In all classrooms, there is a range of students, and a teacher's goal to meet the needs of all learners remains the same regardless of classroom organization. Also, the focus of instruction for all subjects is on helping students to advance regardless of age, grade, or current level of performance." (Combined Grades - Ministry of Education, Ontario)

At Sutton PS we will be continuing our work on respectful workplace and learning environment. This means "that we create and maintain a healthy and productive working and learning environment that fosters respect for and is supportive of the dignity, self-esteem and fair treatment of everyone taking part in its activities." Bullying is Wrong! Prevent Bullying Now!

Sutton PS is a bully free zone! We need the students, staff and parents to stand up and speak out against bullying. Students are being advised to inform an adult when they are bullied or witness a bullying incident.

Bullying happens when someone hurts or scares another child on purpose and the person being bullied has a hard time defending themselves. It makes the child being bullied feel afraid or uncomfortable. So everyone needs to get involved to help stop bullying! There are many ways that young people bully each other and they need to realize these behaviours are harmful:

- Punching, shoving and other acts that hurt children physically
- Spreading rumours about people
- Keeping certain people out of a group
- Teasing people in a mean way
- Getting certain people to "gang up" on others

This happens at school, in the community and on the internet! Facebook and ASK FM are two sites where many of the internet bullying behaviours occur so it is important that parents monitor their child's use of the internet. Children can lose confidence when they are bullied and may isolate themselves from their friends.

Bullying also hurts the bystanders as they are afraid they could be the next victim. They avoid getting involved in order to protect themselves or because they aren't sure what to do.

Bullying can have an effect on learning. Stress and anxiety caused by bullying and harassment can make it more difficult for kids to concentrate and can decrease their ability to focus, which affects their ability to remember things they have learned.

We have asked the students and school community to STAND UP AND SPEAK OUT AGAINST BULLYING! We have asked the students to tell their teacher or parents when they see bullying happening. We all need to work together to support our students at school, at home, and in the community.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Re: Student Busing Eligibility

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

Dress Code: REMINDER

It is important that students dress appropriately for the task of learning. Please note that clothing which demonstrates respect for self and others is expected at all times. After consulting with many North elementary schools, there is a consistency with the following rule:

If it begins with a 'B' we don't want to see it

This includes: bras, bellies, boxers, briefs, and bare skin in places that should be covered by clothing.

Some guidelines are as follows:

Students:

Are responsible for choosing appropriate clothing to be worn to school which follows the dress code and expectations outlined above

Teachers

At the beginning of the day teachers will speak to any student not showing responsibility for making appropriate clothing choices which follow the dress code and expectations outlined above

Natural Consequence

Students who are not making responsible choices will be asked by the teacher to change into alternate clothing (either their own or provided by the school) which adheres to the school dress code and expectations, and may be asked to call home for a change of clothes.

We are a NUT FREE School

"It is the policy (Policy# 662) of the York Region District School Board that all students are entitled to safe and healthy environments, including an allergen safe environment in our schools." We have staff and students at Black River P.S. who have severe, life threatening allergies to peanuts and/or other nut products. Some children will suffer anaphylactic shock if they are exposed to peanuts or peanut products. Even the smell of peanuts (or other nuts) can be fatal to highly allergic children. Therefore, we must endeavour to create a nut and nut product free zone including those products that may contain nuts or traces of nuts in the interest of the health and safety of our children. Sutton PS is a designated a 'Nut Safe Environment'. You will notice posters on all of our school entrances. Search and Seizure

In order to promote safety at school, it is important to remind all school community members of the right for school administrators to search school property, such as lockers and desks, without notice or permission of any person. Further, police may also, from time to time, be invited to conduct a search of school property; such searches may be conducted without notice to, or permission of, any member of the school community other than the principal. Such instances as noted above shall be documented accordingly.

Student Safety

Students who ride bicycles, scooters or skateboards to school must:

- Wear a helmet—for bikes, it is the law!
- Keep the bicycle locked on the bicycle rack
- Walk the bicycle, scooter or skateboard on and off school property


Information Access & Privacy

Students Requiring Medication

Keeping our children safe is a priority for all of us. Please remember that students are not allowed to carry medication at school. Epipens, puffers and insulin are the only exceptions due to life-threatening reasons (all Epipens and puffers must have a current date). All students who use Epipens must have two at the school at all times. One must be carried by the student and one will remain in the office.

Depending on your child's health needs and medication requirements, there are several forms that must be completed immediately. Please check with the office for the required forms.

All medications will be kept in a locked location and administered the designated times. All medications must be in a bottle from the pharmacy clearly stating the child's name and dosage and they must have a current date.





Kiss & Ride Drop Off Zone



Thank you to the parents for following the integrity of the "Kiss & Ride" drop off area. The cars are moving quickly as parents manoeuvre safety through the parking lot. Parents who need to get out of the car are parking so that they are not holding up the cars behind them.
