SDHS Student Guideline Information for Examinations

Exam Days

The examination period is June 18 - 25th. Only Grade 12 period 4 exams will be written on Tuesday, June 18th. It is a regular school day for all other students. E-Learning exams will be on Monday, June 17th. Please check your exam schedule for dates and

<u>times.</u> Students are required to be in school only when they are writing a scheduled exam. Students who write an examination in the morning and do not have transportation home should report to the cafeteria or library. You will not be allowed to hang around the hallways because scheduled performance exams and written exams will still be occurring.

Bussing

Busses will pick up and drop off at usual school day times for exam days and exam review day. There will be no late busses available after June 18th.

PA Day

June 27 and 28 are professional activity (PA) days and students are expected to not attend school.

Dismissal from Exams

Students must remain in their exam room for at least the first hour of their exam. Teachers will dismiss students at the appropriate time.

If you are writing 1½ hour exams please remember when you finish to move <u>quietly</u> to the Library, Café or out of the building, respecting the rights of students who have not completed their exams. Please bring all of your belongings to the exam with you. The library will be closed on **June 25th** for the community class graduation.

Check the Schedule Carefully

It is the responsibility of each student to know his/her exam schedule. The day of your exam is dependent upon when you have the class as written on your timetable.

Arrival Time

On the day of your exam arrive before 9:15am. Room schedules will be posted outside the cafeteria and main office if you have forgotten the location. Check the schedule when arriving to make sure the room number has not changed. If you are more than 10 minutes late for your exam, report to the Main Office and you will be escorted to your exam location.

Textbook

Please make sure that you bring any outstanding textbooks to the exam supervisor during the exam period. There is a replacement cost for any lost or damaged textbooks.

Absences

The completion of some courses requires that examinations be written. Failure to write an exam will mean that a credit may be in jeopardy. Students may be excused from an exam only in the following circumstances: death in the family, illness/injury when supported by a medical certificate, or court appearance with court notification. All require the authorization of the principal or vice-principal. Please see an administrator if circumstances prevent you from writing on your scheduled exam day.

What to Bring

All necessary equipment such as pens, pencils, calculators, mathematical sets, rulers and erasers must be provided by students. Bring an extra pen. You may bring water bottles.

Books, bags, coats, etc., are to be placed at the front of the room before the examination begins, unless otherwise instructed by the presiding teacher.

Cell phones and other electronic devices not prescribed by your academic program are not to be brought to the examination rooms. Any talking or electronic communication while writing exams may result in a mark of zero.

Washrooms

Students may not leave their seats during an examination. If a student must use the washroom they will be escorted by a teacher. Students shall remain in the examination room until dismissed by the supervising teacher.

Elementary Schools

During exams Sutton District High School students are not allowed to visit the area Elementary Schools without the permission of the Elementary School Principal.
