Dear Parents / Guardians,

We would like to inform you that we have been nominated as a ‘Select School’ by the International Maths Olympiad Challenge. The Olympiad, which is into its 25th year now, is among the largest Maths Olympiad bodies in the world. Their Olympiads are now online, and they conduct a unique Maths Olympiad called the Online Simulated Maths Olympiad. This Olympiad is reserved for Select Schools only, and we have been chosen as one of the Select Schools in Canada.

The Olympiad will be conducted online on **May 28-29**, and the results will be declared the following week. As Sutton District High School, Sutton is a Selected School, your child can participate in the Olympiad for free. There are a couple of value-added services the Olympiad provides, which attract a fee. But you can opt for the ‘Olympiad only’ free version. To do so, you need to first create a [login](#) and enrol [here](#) using the code SDH@IMO in the fees section. This code is for our students only and reduces the fees of any of the 4 Selected School courses by \$27, making the first course (‘Olympiad only’) a free version.

The morning session will kick off with our keynote speaker, Jon Callegher from [Job Talks](#) followed by a moderated panel discussion with past graduates. After a hot lunch, students will have the opportunity to explore the **Pathways & Career Expo** where they can connect with representatives from employment agencies, industry, skilled trades associations, colleges etc

Specifically, this conference is for graduating students who:

- **are leaving secondary school at the end of the semester** and are interested or currently working in the skilled trades towards apprenticeship, or are OYAP/Accelerated OYAP students; **and/or**
- **are leaving secondary school at the end of the semester** and are entering directly to the workforce; **and/or**
- are currently enrolled grade 12 SHSM students heading to **apprenticeship or the workplace.** (This event may count as a 'Reach Ahead')
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Registration must take place 4:00 pm on May 11, 2022 and space is limited. Please let Ms. Crozier in guidance know as soon as possible of your interest in this opportunity.

- Students are required to get school approval and provide a copy of the form **prior** to completing their activities
- As a general rule, students **can not** complete hours in a for-profit-business

Due to COVID restrictions, **for 2021 - 2022 school year only**, the Ministry of Education has allowed the following activities that are not normally acceptable:

- Activities that include **up to 10 hours** of paid work, with the requirement to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to service for others. - Activities such as walking a younger neighbour or sibling to and from school or helping younger siblings with their homework
- Activities that consist of duties normally performed in the home (e.g. students could help an elderly relative with errands, provide after-school care for a sibling)
- Students who **graduate** within the 2021-2022 school year (prior to June 30, 2022) will need **20** community hours - the requirement for graduation after this date remains at 40 hours

ATTENDANCE

Student attendance is directly related to student success. It is very important that students are at school on time and in class daily. At Sutton District High School, when a student misses a class without a valid reason, our automated attendance program will phone home and email in the evening stating what grade the student is in and what class(es) were missed that day. If parents have any questions regarding the reported absence, they should check with their child and their child's teacher.

VALID ABSENCES

Only absences due to illness, medical/dental/legal appointments, bereavement, and school-sponsored activities are valid. All other absences, including missed buses and oversleeping are invalid. When a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that the parent(s)/guardian(s) confirm knowledge of the validity of the absence.

Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are asked to call or email the attendance office at 722-3267 or sutton.dhs@yrdsb.ca (accessible 24 hours daily) on the morning of each day their child will be absent. Informing of the absence prior to the day or on the day of the absence will allow the information to be entered and will prevent the need for a phone call home or for the student to obtain an admit slip upon return. In certain instances, medical documentation may be required. Students are responsible for informing teachers in advance of an anticipated absence. **Students are responsible for all missed work (tests, assignments, class notes) when absent and are encouraged to obtain this work from their teacher beforehand when possible.**
