PARENT-TEACHER INTERVIEWS:

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test OSSLT:

The OSSLT is a graduation requirement that is written. The test is based on skills acquired by the end of Grade 9. Students write the test in their Grade 10 year.

All SDHS Grade 10 students will write the OSSLT in the last week of April. More details will be available next week.

Students in *Grades 11 and 12* who have not yet successfully completed the OSSLT will also have the opportunity to write the OSSLT during the last week of April to complete this graduation requirement. *Gr. 12 Students who are expected in June are not required to complete the OSSLT this year only, however any Gr. 12 students who return next year will be required to complete the test successfully in order to graduate.*

ATTENDANCE

Student attendance is directly related to student success. It is very important that students are at school on time and in class daily. At Sutton District High School, when a student misses a class without a valid reason, our automated attendance program will phone home and email in the evening stating what grade the student is in and what class(es) were missed that day. If parents have any questions regarding the reported absence, they should check with their child and their child's teacher.

VALID ABSENCES

Only absences due to illness, medical/dental/legal appointments, bereavement, and school-sponsored activities are valid. All other absences, including missed buses and oversleeping are invalid. When a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that the parent(s)/guardian(s) confirm knowledge of the validity of the absence.

Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are asked to call or email the attendance office at 722-3267 or sutton.dhs@yrdsb.ca (accessible 24 hours daily) on the morning of each day their child will be absent. Informing of the absence prior to the day or on the day of the absence will allow the information to be entered and will prevent the need for a phone call home or for the student to obtain an admit slip upon return. In certain instances, medical documentation may be required. Students are responsible for informing teachers in advance of an anticipated absence. **Students are responsible for all missed work (tests, assignments, class notes) when absent and are encouraged to obtain this work from their teacher beforehand when possible.**
