# **Students/Staff with Anaphylaxis**

There are students and staff members in our school who have a life-threatening allergy to nuts and scents which can cause an anaphylactic reaction.

Anaphylaxis is an allergic reaction that it so severe that it can cause death. The throat closes and the person cannot breathe. This allergic condition differs from any other allergic reactions in that it is life-threatening. Even contact with trace amounts of the nut allergen (through ingestion or touch) or breathing in some chemicals found in many scented products can trigger this type of reaction. The ONLY way to ensure a safe environment is to avoid bringing nuts, nut products and scented products onto the school premises. To do this, we need everyone's cooperation. Please help us to keep Sutton District High School a safe environment.

## **Important Information for Students Turning 18**

Under the Education Act, parents/guardians have a right to access their child's Ontario Student Record if the child is under 18.

If the student is 18 or over, the Board/school must follow the privacy provisions of the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act regarding the disclosure of personal information about the student to their parents/guardians.

Students 18 or over must provide written permission by signing the <u>Consent for Information Sharing</u> form to allow parents/guardians to continue to access school-related information about the student. This includes academic progress, attendance and behaviour.

Students can also obtain the form from the school office.
