EOP Small Engines Program Partners with Chippewas of Georgina Island First Nation

Students from Sutton District High School enrolled in the Exploring Opportunities Program with a focus on small engines are participating in an exciting partnership with the Chippewas of Georgina Island First Nation. Students received training and hands on experience in forest management while assisting the First Nation in management of the threat to island forests posed by the Emerald Ash Borer.

Students and staff, in partnership with band members, identified and selectively logged Ash trees in the central part of the Island. Forestry techniques, chain saw skills and safe forest practices are being offered to students through a



variety of partnerships. Instruction around cultural practices used while working within the First Nation was offered to the students. Two days were spent each week in the forest, while two days are spent on classroom instruction and equipment maintenance.

Hands on experience for students included developing a plan for felling each tree, practice in notching and wedging techniques, and when ready, using a chain saw to drop trees to the forest floor. Students also section logs into appropriate lengths for future milling and devise and execute a plan for the transportation of these logs to pick up points on the Island.

Congratulations to the students of Sutton District High School and the Chippewas of Georgina Island First Nation on a successful, innovative and engaging partnership!

Reporting a Student Absence

Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are asked to call the Attendance Office at 722-3267, (accessible 24 hours daily) or write a note to verify their child's absence.

Allergies/Medical Conditions

There are students and staff members in our school who have life-threatening allergies to nuts and other allergens. If they smell or come into contact with these foods, they may have an anaphylactic reaction.

To help create an allergen-safe environment, do not bring nut or nut products (especially peanut products), or sprays with odour (such as perfume or colognes) to school.

If your child has a serious or life-threatening allergy or medical condition, let the school know immediately and speak to the school office about completing the appropriate medical forms. There are students in our school who have a life-threatening allergy to nuts and other allergens. If they smell or come into contact with these foods, they may have an anaphylactic reaction.

We request that staff and students refrain from bringing peanut products into the building. Peanut products are not sold in our school vending machines or cafeteria. Please inform the school, if your son or daughter has any allergies. Care and caution must be used when eating outside the cafeteria. Additional items may be restricted based on information that we receive throughout the year.

Many students and staff members are highly sensitive to perfumes, colognes, aftershaves and other scented products. By choosing to use unscented personal care products, we can make Sutton District High School a better place for all of us to learn and work.

Community Volunteer Hours

Students are now required to submit the form for Community Volunteer Hours PRIOR to volunteering. The students will need to get pre-approval from a Guidance Counsellor and have the form returned to them BEFORE they volunteer. This will require a minimum one-week turnaround time. Please ensure that you follow these procedures so that you can get credit for all of your Community Volunteer Hours. Students are reminded that any hours obtained over the summer should be handed into the Guidance office.

As a graduation requirement, students are required to complete 40 hours of community volunteer hours.
