# Trial Online Administration of the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

Please see below the letter from the Education Quality and Accountability Office re: OSSLT Online test Dear Parents/Guardians:

This letter is to inform you that today [Oct. 20] the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) trial of the online Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) in which your child was scheduled to participate was **discontinued** by EQAO at 11:00 am due to major, widespread technical issues. These issues at the EQAO site prevented students from accessing the test.

There is no penalty to students for having not completed the test. ALL students will have the opportunity to write the regularly scheduled OSSLT on March 30, 2017.

On Saturday October 8, 2016 in the afternoon, the iconic old barn, ClearWater, at the Reed Farm burnt to the ground. No one was hurt. The tragic accident was caused by kids playing on the property without permission. But, out of adversity came opportunity. October 17-23 – **Sukkot** is a harvest festival or thanksgiving. Small huts are constructed in which meals are eaten, weather permitting, to commemorate the time when the Israelites dwelled in booths in the desert for 40 years.

October 24 – **Shemini Atzeret** is a festival marking the end of the holiday of Sukkot on which a special prayer for rain is recited.

October 25 - **Simchat Torah** is marked by singing and dancing which celebrates the end of public reading of the Torah in the synagogue and the beginning of its reading anew.

Students are now required to submit the form for Community Volunteer Hours PRIOR to volunteering. Students are reminded that any hours obtained over the summer should be handed into the Guidance office.

As a graduation requirement, students are required to complete 40 hours of community volunteer hours.
