# The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) is going online!!

On Thursday, October 20, after several years of research, development, consultation, trial runs and system checks, EQAO will take the important step of holding a large-scale assessment of OSSLT-eligible students in a digital environment. Open to all of Ontario's secondary schools, this is a critical trial of EQAO's online testing system and of schools' and school boards' technological capacity to support online assessments. At SDHS, all grade 10 students will be participating in the online administration of this test. In addition, all previously-eligible students who are not enrolled in the OLC (literacy course) for the 2016/2017 school year will be participating. In addition to the classroom preparation provided for this test, there are sample materials and sample tests on the EQAO website. Additional support and/or practice materials can be provided by Lisa Schneppenheim, SDHS's Literacy Teacher. Lunch n' Learn sessions for students will also be offered in October.

Please note, if students are unsuccessful and/or there are technological issues during this online administration, all students will still have the regularly scheduled OSSLT in March 2017 to satisfy their literacy requirement. Those who pass the online test will not have to write the one scheduled in March.

# International Baccalaureate Program Information Evening

The International Baccalaureate (IB) program is student-centred with a focus on developing intellectual, personal, emotional and social skills for students who live, learn and work in a rapidly changing world. The program emphasizes critical, compassionate thinking, community involvement and intercultural understanding. It is founded on international standards and assessment. Students who complete the program earn both an Ontario Secondary School Diploma and an IB Diploma.

# Valid Absences

Only absences due to illness, medical/dental/legal appointments, bereavement, and school-sponsored activities are valid. All other absences, including missed buses and oversleeping are invalid. When a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that his or her parent(s)/guardian(s) confirm knowledge of the validity of the absence. Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are asked to call the Attendance Office at 722-3267 (accessible 24 hours daily) on the morning of each day their child will be absent or write a note verifying the absence. Informing of the absence prior to the day or on the day of the absence will allow the information to be entered and will prevent the need for a phone call home or for the student to obtain an admit slip upon return. If no phone call documentation may be required. Students who are 18 years of age or older are to sign in and out at the Attendance Office when leaving or entering the school for any reason. Students are responsible for informing teachers in advance of an anticipated absence. Students are responsible for all missed work (tests, assignments, class notes) when absent and are encouraged to obtain this work from their teacher beforehand when possible.

# Holidays and Observances

#### Hinduism

October 1-9 – **Navaratri (Fall)** is a nine-day celebration of the Divine Goddess for good health, happiness and knowledge.

October 10 – **Thanksgiving** - Many cultures have a time to celebrate the end of the growing season when all crops have been harvested for winter. The ancient Greeks, Romans and Egyptians all celebrated at harvest time and thanked their gods and goddesses. Today, throughout the world, we still celebrate at this time.

#### Judaism

October 12 – **Yom Kippur**, the day of Atonement, is the most solemn of the Jewish Holy Days. At synagogue, the evening service is called Kol Nidre. People ask for forgiveness of their sins and forgive others. Jews refrain from all eating and drinking on this day.

#### Islam

October 12 – **Ashura** falls on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Muharram. The 10<sup>th</sup> day commemorates the Martydom of Hussein, the grandson of the Prophet Muhammed (pbuh).

As a graduation requirement, students are required to complete 40 hours of community volunteer hours. # Loran Scholarship Information

There are less than three weeks left for Grade 12 students to submit sponsored applications for the Loran Awards. Sutton District High School can sponsor up to three students for our <u>university scholarships</u>, 30 of which are valued at up to \$100,000 over four years.

The application process includes the submission of a reference letter and the confirmation of school sponsorship, both of which must be completed by **Wednesday October 19, 2016**. **Please note** that if you wish Sutton District High School to sponsor you that your completed application must be brought to guidance no later than **October 7, 2016** so that consideration may be given to sponsorship. **Submission of your application to guidance does not guarantee sponsorship**.
