What is SHSM?

- ⦿ SHSM allows students to focus their learning on a specific economic sector.
- ⦿ Students gain career-relevant certifications and training while they explore their future goals.
- ⦿ This allows students to make informed decisions about post-secondary destinations.

Who is SHSM for?

SHSM is for students who are looking at any of these possible careers (and more!)

Health and Wellness: Nurse, doctor, therapist, dentist, PSW, medical secretary, lab technician, pharmacist, ECE, teacher, CYW, coach, recreation director, vet, vet tech, police officer, firefighter, fitness trainer

Transportation: Pilot, Aerospace engineer, aircraft assembler, urban planner, automotive repair, coach/truck technician, marine engine repair, small engine tech, railway maintenance

What does SHSM involve?

Many students are under the impression that this is an 'additional course'. This is not the case. SHSM requirements are as follows:

- ⦿ a bundle of eight to ten Grade 11 and Grade 12 credits; (these courses are likely already in their timetable!)
- ⦿ 7 sector recognised certifications and training courses, including First Aid and CPR;
- ⦿ 2 Co-op credits (experiential learning activities within the sector);
- ⦿ "reach ahead" experiences in the student's post-secondary destination of choice

What do students gain from SHSM?

- ✓ Graduate with a 'Red Seal' Diploma
- ✓ Industry recognized certifications
- ✓ Experiential Learning opportunities
- ✓ Trips to post-secondary locations
- ✓ Activities and trips to meet experts in the industry
