WOW Butter Reminder...

A substitute peanut butter product is being marketed to consumers as a safe alternative for children to bring to schools in place of peanut butter. We ask that parents refrain from including these kinds of products in your child's lunches or snacks. These products tend to look, taste, and smell very much like peanut butter. While the product is nut free, it mimics a known allergen that causes anaphylaxis in some children to the degree that it is indistinguishable from the

allergen. It is a convincing substitute, opening up the possibility that it can be confused as peanut butter, or worse yet, peanut butter could be confused as this soy-based product. The safety and well-being of our students is our first priority, which is why our schools have procedures in place to minimize risk of anaphylaxis reactions in our students. We sincerely appreciate your cooperation in avoiding the use of these products to assist in our continued efforts to create a safe, caring and inclusive learning environment for all students.

Scooters

We have run out of indoor space for our scooters! We are storing approximately 15 scooters on a daily basis in our spare office. This is posing a safety risk for the staff members & students that utilize this space during the day (e.g. our school Psychologist, Speech & Language Pathologist, Inter-disciplinary staff, students working and teachers accessing the OSRs). As a result, we have purchased a scooter rack which will be installed beside our bike rack on the north east corner of the school. The scooter rack will have the option of locking up the scooters and can hold up to twenty. Should we require an additional rack, we will look at purchasing that in the spring.

Field Trips

Field trips support curriculum and provide students with educational experiences that enhance classroom learning. Students do not pay for mandatory field trips. Non-mandatory field trips may have a cost associated with them and every reasonable effort will be made to ensure no student is excluded from participating. Students who are unable to go on a trip are required to be at school where they will receive alternate programming.



Recess Time Switch

In order to work through some operational issues, we have postponed switching our eating and play times during recesses until after the December Break. Having the students play outside first allows our staff to take students directly outdoors optimizing our supervision, gives them a physical break after working at their desks, stimulates appetite and allows our younger students to have a little more time to eat if needed. Our new routine will begin when students return to school in January.



Spectator Behaviour at Athletic Events
