REGISTRATION INFORMATION

In accordance with Ministry of Education guidelines, schools will not charge fees for supplies relating to coursework that is necessary to meet graduation requirements; e.g., French workbooks, Family Studies food labs. The Fees Guidelines allows schools to charge fees for enhanced materials, i.e. enrichments beyond what is necessary to meet curriculum expectations such as: certifications; Iron Chef Competition; art kit; cedar wood in construction; and field trips. In classes that charge for enhancements, you will receive a letter from the teacher detailing what the fee covers. Payment of the enhancement fee is voluntary.

In addition, fees can be charged for participating in extra-curricular activities such as sports teams, clubs, dances, graduation, etc. Our School Activity Fee serves to engage students in the broader school community by providing a wide range of opportunities that occur before school, at lunch and after school. Monies collected will cover or subsidize the cost of various extra-curricular activities in clubs, teams, sports, and student groups such as the Students' Council. These groups, events and activities build school spirit and enrich the learning experience beyond the classroom and the designated subject curriculum. This is an important element in building and strengthening the sense of community at TSS. With the payment of the Student Activity Fee, students receive discounts for various events; e.g., Semi-formal and Prom.

Our department goal is to help ensure that our identified students have a smooth transition to high school. Approximately one in three students at Thornhill Secondary School is identified as having an exceptionality and has an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) to help ensure success. Although accommodations listed on an IEP can help, another way of achieving success is choosing the appropriate courses and levels. To this end, *Identification, Placement, and Review Committee (IPRC)* meetings are held yearly with students and their families to determine appropriate levels of support, and to help ensure a smooth transition. Timetabling is a crucial step in the process and we work on personalizing each student's timetable according to the discussion and decisions made during the IPRC process. We welcome you to Thornhill and look forward to assisting in your success at the secondary level.



Welcome to ESL at TSS!



Thornhill Secondary School has a vibrant and expanding English as a Second Language (ESL) program. Our ESL program supports the integration of new English language learners into the school and our community. In addition to our ESL classes, we also offer subject-specific courses in grade 9 Geography and Science. In this way, students will develop language and literacy skills in a variety of academic settings.

We have many courses designed with the English language learner (ELL) in mind. For example, we have a course for beginner ELLs (English language learners) called "Presentation and Speaking Skills". It has been a great success and the students have had the opportunity to focus on improving their pronunciation and presentation skills.

TSS also has an active ESL Club, called the "Hand in Hand Club". This year they successfully celebrated Asian New Year in February, the Persian New Year (Naw Ruz) in March, and hosted a massive Asian Heritage Festival in May where our own Asian Heritage Band performed.

DRESS CODE

EQAO TESTS

Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics

All students working toward a credit in Grade 9 Academic or Applied Mathematics are required to participate in the EQAO math test in the semester they take their Math course. These tests evaluate how well students are meeting the curriculum expectations of the Grade 9 Academic or Applied Mathematics courses from *The Ontario Curriculum*.



Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

The *Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)* measures whether or not students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9.

Successful completion of the literacy test is one of the requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Communication

Effective communication between home and school is a high priority for members of TSS. Here are some ways in which we can communicate about specific individuals' needs, and for families to keep up-to-date on events at Thornhill:

Guidance Counsellors and Vice-Principals – Every student is assigned a Guidance Counsellor and a Vice-Principal. Apart from your Homeroom Teacher, these two individuals are your key communication contact. Student contacts are determined alphabetically, by last name.

School Council – At regularly scheduled meetings, parents and guardians have a forum to receive information about the school, and to share input on school matters. Please join us. Meeting dates are listed on the school's website.

Information Evenings – This is a chance to visit the school and to learn about important topics. Among other things, you will have a chance to tour the school, to meet school staff and/or presenters from post-secondary institutions.


Parent-Teacher Interview Nights – You will have opportunity to meet with each of your child's teachers once each semester, to discuss your child's progress. These meetings are by appointment.

Teacher Meetings/Conferences – You are welcome to phone your child's teachers at the school with queries or to share information. You may wish to arrange a meeting time to address your concerns.

A message from your Guidance Department

Welcome future Grade 9 students! We look forward to working with you over the next 4 years at Thornhill Secondary School.

Your Guidance counsellors are here to assist you in many ways. We provide academic support by helping you select courses in the appropriate pathways during course selection and throughout the year; we can work with you to develop organization and time management strategies; we can also help you identify your short and long term goals.

The Guidance Department facilitates a peer tutor program, as well as provides up-to-date information on volunteer opportunities. When it comes time to researching your post-secondary destinations, Guidance will help ensure that you are familiar with all of your options. We will also provide information to help you choose the appropriate high school courses to assist you.

In addition to academic counselling, we provide personal and crisis counselling. We are here to listen, to support you and to connect you with additional resources outside the school if necessary. Whether you are experiencing anxiety over school work, relationship concerns with friends or family, or simply need someone to talk to – we are available.

Our Guidance Office is located directly across from the Main Office, and we hope that you will visit us and take advantage of the many supports we offer.

The Individual Pathway Plan (IPP) is a program to support students' learning and growth. Students are assisted in developing a clear plan for their initial post secondary destination. The IPP uses a four-step process that encourages students to answer the following questions: Who Am I?, What are my opportunities?, What do I want to become? and What are my plans for achieving my goals? By contemplating these questions and developing the IPP, students take responsibility for their learning and for planning their future. On two separate occasions next year, students will be developing their IPP. Please stay tuned for more information.



Community Involvement Hours

All secondary school students must complete 40 hours of community involvement as part of their graduation requirements. These hours may be completed at any time prior to graduation, beginning in the summer following grade 8.

Steps for completing your Community Involvement:

1. Review which community involvement activities are considered eligible and ineligible.
2. Search for volunteer activities that meet the criteria on the eligible list.
3. Complete the **Notification and Completion of Community Involvement Activities** form for **PRE-APPROVAL**.
4. **PRE-APPROVAL** can be completed by your Grade 8 teacher, Grade 8 office staff, or Thornhill Secondary School's Main Office during the summer months.
5. Complete your volunteer placement.
6. Submit the completed form to Thornhill Secondary School's Guidance Secretary in September.



A NOTE TO PARENTS: STARTING WELL



Research indicates that students who have a good start in Grade 9 tend to be more successful during their entire high school career. Knowing the importance of this strong start, we focus intentionally on our youngest students. We value and welcome the input of parents and guardians in making sure that our Grade 9 students have a great year. Here are some things which you can do:

- Hold reasonably high expectations for your child;
- Help your child stay organized and effective with time management. Encourage daily use of the Student Agenda Book;
- Encourage your child to become involved in extracurricular activities. The more students get reasonably involved, the more connected they will feel, resulting in greater commitment, pride and confidence;
- Establish a regular work time for your child to complete homework and study;
- See to it that your child attends school regularly and on time;
- Notify the school of changes in your contact information, or of changes in your child's health;
- Consult the school if you have concerns about your child's progress;
- Familiarize yourself with school expectations, codes and procedures in the Student Agenda Book;
- Acquaint yourself with course expectations in course outlines; and get involved in the School Council.

On behalf of the staff at Thornhill, we welcome you to the school community and thank you for your continuous involvement. Let us work together to ensure that the next four years bring much success and fulfillment to your child's goals and dreams.




SCHOOL INFORMATION

GUIDANCE SERVICES

Timetable changes will be made for exceptional reasons only and by completing a request to change your timetable form.

See a Guidance Counsellor as soon as possible if you:

- ◆ Have a blank space on your timetable;
- ◆ Are missing or have too many compulsory courses in one semester



OFFICE HOURS

On Tuesday, July 3rd summer hours will begin. The school office will be open Monday to Thursday from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm. Please note that the office will be closed from July 27th to August 3rd.

PARENT e-MAIL

Parents are requested to supply the school with a current e-mail address for at least one parent or guardian. E-mail information is kept confidential and is used solely for the purpose of keeping all parents informed about school events, student attendance, minutes of school council meetings, school newsletters, bulletins, schedules, etc. Parent e-mail addresses should be sent to thornhill.ss@yrdsb.ca

If your email address changes during the year, then please remember to notify the school of the change as soon as possible.

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Detailed information about learning opportunities, behavioural and course expectations, student responsibilities, school year calendar, and various procedures is contained in the Student Agenda Book. Students and parents will be required to sign-off that you have reviewed start-up package and the policies at the start of the school year. This information is also posted on the school website.

TEXTBOOKS

Teachers will distribute textbooks at the start of each semester. Students are responsible for keeping books in good condition, and for returning them at the end of the semester. Replacement costs for lost or damaged textbooks are the responsibility of the student.

TRANSPORTATION

Generally, no busing is provided for secondary school students who live in an area served by public transit. Students who are eligible for transportation will be placed on a school bus run jointly by the York Region District School and Separate School Boards. Information is available at

Step 2: Confirmation Email

A registration confirmation email will be automatically forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm your email and School Cash Online account. The confirmation link will open the School Cash Online site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

Step 3: Find Student

This step will connect your children to your account.

- Enter the School Board Name
- Enter the School Name
- Enter Your Child's Student # and Last Name
- Select **Continue**
- On the next page confirm that you are related to the child, check in the Agree box and select **Continue**
- Your child has been added to your account

Step 4: View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children, select "Add Another Student" option and repeat the steps above. 5 children can be added to one parent account.

If you do not wish to add additional children, select "View Items For Students" option. A listing of available items for purchase will be displayed.

Read a couple of books over the summer, especially *Romeo and Juliet*, and *To Kill a Mockingbird*, since this will help you to become familiar with the plot of the 2 books used in the grade 9 English curriculum, especially if you aren't a fast reader.

- Don't search up "what is high school like" on Google/don't worry or be scared: stereotypes of high school tend to be negative, TSS is nothing like those stereotypes
- make changes a week before school resumes, wake up as if you were to go to school, as this will prevent an abrupt change in your sleeping schedule when the semester starts
- on Registration Day, pick up your timetable and Agenda Book. They are really, really helpful.
- make sure you have all your school supplies - binders, dividers, papers etc.
- In the beginning of summer, decide on 1 habit that you want to fix by the end of the break: It is proven that it takes 21 days of consciously not repeating a habit to fix it. (from G.E.)

Many will tell you the exact same thing; that high school is the hardest thing you will go through. I have to disagree. High school is and will be the best four years of your life, if you choose to apply yourself in all areas. There will be a time to play, a time to talk and a time study; however it's how you choose to use those times that will bring you to the finish line.
