1. What is your special program?

Answer: We offer the following specialized programs: Advanced Placement (AP), Gifted Program, Regional ELD Program, High Performance Athlete Program, PEAK, and Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM). For more information, please click on the <u>following link</u>.

2. What science courses/programs do you have?

3. Do you have any arts/music program?

Answer: We don't have a specialized arts/music program, but we do offer a variety of arts (visual and dramatic) and music courses, as well as a number extra-curricular activities. 4. Do you have a bus service?

Answer: No, there is no transportation service available.

5. When the school finishes, can the student do their homework at school and wait for parents to pick them up?

Answer: Due to COVID-19 protocols, students must depart the school on days that they are in school at 11:00 am. When school returns to regular schedules, students can wait for parents to pick them up and complete their homework while waiting, however there is no staff supervision after school.

6. If my son decides to join your school, what is the deadline for registration?

Answer: Registration deadlines depend on if the student is coming from a YRDSB elementary school <u>inside the Thornhill SS boundary</u>, YRDSB elementary school outside the Thornhill SS boundary, or a non-YRDSB elementary school. GIFTED PROGRAM

1. I would like to learn more about Gifted Programs

Answer: Our Gifted program is for students who meet the intellectual ability criterion as outlined in the Ministry categories and definitions. The Gifted program begins in Grade 9 and ends in Grade 10 with the opportunity to continue in Advanced Placement (AP) courses in Grades 11 and 12. Gifted courses that are offered in both grades 9 and 10 are Math, English, Science, French, Geography (grade 9 only) and History (Grade 10 only). Our goal is to cultivate, lead, and inspire innovative thinkers and expert communicators through a focus on challenging meaningful and engaging classroom activities and assessments. Our learning environments promote a love of learning and can ignite a passion to pursue more in-depth studies.

2. Could you please comment on the options for gifted programs please. Is there a pre-ap gifted program and a regular gifted program? If my child is in a gifted program in elementary school... What are his options? Also, can you provide more details on the difference with the gifted program and pre-ap program.

Answer: Thornhill Secondary School has a Pre-Advanced Placement (AP) program in Grade 9 and 10. There is an application to complete for entrance into the program. Please see the <u>TSS AP Flyer</u> for additional information. Gifted students are identified in elementary and transition directly into our Gifted program. Our Gifted students have the opportunity to continue into



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Advanced Placement courses in Grades 11 and 12 if they choose. The AP pathway continues to be open to students after Grade 10. Gifted courses that are offered in both grades 9 and 10 are

3. My son is a student of Henderson Avenue Public School gift program, if I want to study at Thornhill SS, I need to apply?

Answer: There is no need to apply or transfer as Thornhill Secondary School is the gifted feeder school. We would have an IPRC meeting that is set up by the elementary gifted classroom teacher. A registration form will need to be completed and courses will be selected through My Pathway Planner. The Guidance Department is currently preparing a presentation for elementary schools to support course option selection and registration steps.

4. What are the advantages of the gifted program as compared to IB program, how is the gifted program unique and has its advantages?

Answer: The Gifted program supports students academically, socially and emotionally through innovative classroom instruction and by ensuring a student's IEP is fully supported. Students have the support and guidance from Special Education Resource Teachers who work with them throughout their high school experience to help ensure their success. Students in our gifted program have the potential to achieve beyond what is expected of their same-age peers. At TSS, they are given the opportunity to understand their true abilities and passions through the exposure of innovative and engaging course curriculum. In addition, they have access to a vast number of leadership opportunities that are available through our extracurricular and co-curricular activities and programs. 5. For the gifted program, what is the ratio of the time that a certified teacher leads the education?

Answer: Students must take at least 4 or 5 gifted courses per year to meet the 51% of the instructional day requirement for the partially integrated programming of the gifted program. All courses are delivered by certified OCT teachers.
