



**MINUTES**  
**Thursday, March 21, 2013**

## **1. York Region Police Presentation**

Officer Christopher VandenBos spoke about drug use. The following are some points from his presentation.

Drugs are more dangerous now than they were in the past:

- Stronger now, more potent
- They often contain additives, possibly dangerous ones, e.g. household cleaners
- Cocaine is cut with household products as filler. Usually they are harmless, but not always, e.g. Drano

Drugs also include cough syrup, which can be easily found in household cupboards.

Worst/Most addictive drug: methamphetamine. Can become addicted after first use, stay addicted for life. Cheap and easy to make from products readily available in grocery/pharmacy.

Marijuana is not actually a 'safe' drug – using it opens the user up to experimenting with drugs in general and makes them more likely to switch.

Farm Party: Kids all bring drugs to a party - whatever (legal/prescription) they could find at home. They take random mixtures of drugs, usually with alcohol – can be very dangerous.

Approximate Prices

Weed: 1 g = \$10

Percoset: 80 mg = \$200 (one pill)

Steroids – common but dangerous because high school kids are still growing, they're injected and the drugs aren't pure.

### **3. Treasurer's Report**

As of March 20<sup>th</sup>, \$4785 has been raised through fundraising. This includes \$1025 received in the last month. This is still below our goal of \$6500, so requests for donations will continue to be sent out with newsletters. A new form letter should be created to generate more interest.

Note that some funds (\$650) need to be put aside to be carried over for the next school year. This is normally used to send out fundraising letters.

**Recommendation** for next year's council – send out the letter with the first midterm report card to save on mailing costs.

Votes were taken re allocating funds and the followed were agreed on unanimously:

- carry forward \$650 for next year's council
- \$300 for student awards
- \$175 for staff appreciation breakfast (Thur, June 27, Andy will try to get donations)
- remainder (\$1828.30) for technology (we will get the matching technology grant)

Other expenditures:

- \$300 – Isabelle's bench (money has already been committed)
- \$2700 – technology in semester 1

Note, the annual \$500 grant from YRDSB can be only use for certain items, such as the bench and the student awards (not food or technology).

Reported on the March Break trip to China – they walked Great Wall, Forbidden City, Tiananmen Square, Terra Cotta warriors, World Financial Centre, silk-making factory, etc. Very successful and educational.



## **Mr. Lim**

- Emergency Preparedness – Held the first fire drill for semester 2 on Thursday. Refined process such that students had to report to their own teachers once they got out to the field. Important to quickly ascertain who is accounted for.  
April – will hold a lockdown drill (once per semester, if danger is inside the school) and hold-and-secure drill (once a year, if danger is outside the school)

A question was raised regarding a pandemic plan. There was a strategy during SARS and H1N1, but not currently. If such a situation occurred, school would take direction from the board.

- Earth hour will be observed on Friday at 10:30-11:30 at school. Earth week is Apr 22-26, during which time, the school will go thru eco-certification process
- May 7-10 is mental health week – school social worker will speak at staff meeting in May and at an assembly for the students
