 - Shirley Smullen
 - In addition to parent volunteers, Thornhill SS has community partnerships e.g. York Region Police. They help students to learn about issues such as gangs, drugs, violence, etc. Police will be doing presentations for grade 9 students.
 - ii. Assembly was held this week for grades 10, 11, 12 to review expectations for the year.

- i. Successful Grade 9 Day took place especially the BOSS video(!)
 Speaker this week to assist grade 9 students in integration into high school
- ii. Awareness re school improvement plan. Focus on students and their wellbeing. Developing students' learning skills and work habits

7. Community Report – Adam Saperia

- Introduced the Thornhill Alumni Association and their events and awards.
- In May 2014, they will celebrate the 60th anniversary.

Fundraising

- Shirley introduced the issue of fundraising. Need to decide (as a group) what type
 of fundraising to be done for this school year. That is, would we rather either solicit
 funds via a one-time request for money or do we prefer to do multiple fundraising
 activities.
- For the last few years, fundraising has been targeted toward technology in the school.
- Note that all money raised by fundraising can be matched by the board, up to a maximum of \$6250. Note that the money provided by the school board has limitations on what it may be used for and where items are purchased.
- In addition, it is possible to get support from local businesses. This requires volunteers to manage.

A vote was taken to use the fundraising letter – it was passed unanimously. A letter will be sent, but the contents are still to be decided.

Suggestion: If letter is sent/mailed home, also send out an email to notify parents to look for it.

Some suggestions were made to offer incentives for parents to donate, for example if the fundraising goal is met, the students (all students) receive some benefit. Could be left up to students to suggest what the benefit will be. Or, the more money raised, the better the reward.

- 9. PRO Grant (Speaker Series topic brainstorm)
 - PRO Grant money is available to parent councils to pursue various activities. A
 decision was made last year to use the money to invite speakers to the council
 meetings. Note that the money has some restrictions on what it can be used for.
 - Suggestions for topics: anti bullying, social media safety, drugs (various topics), teenage mental health, teenage relationships, resilient (teenage) parenting, guns & gangs, fake IDs.

10. Open Forum

- Social Media discussed the concern that students not be required to use social media for school assignments.
- Radiation Detector a request was made to measure and reduce/eliminate radiation in schools.
 - Note: all schools in the YRDSB have wireless internet connectivity, so this is something that would be better addressed with the communications department at the board.
- A question was raised about course selection and how courses are chosen and timetables created. It is done almost entirely by software, once you have a student number and are registered.
