Their task was to figure out how to make the roller coaster work within "Wonderland's guidelines" and using only the building materials provided. This engaging inclass activities allowed students to explore their own management styles and those of others, apply transferable skills such as collaboration and critical thinking and gain a bit of insight into project management with constraints such as time, budget and resources. Thornlea Students Achieve High Ranking at Carnegie Mellon Competition

Thornlea's very own "Team YYZ" has ranked in the top 16.5% of the 10,460 international teams that participated in Carnegie Mellon University's PicoCTF (capture the flag) competition—a reflection of their steadfast ability and determination. Since the club just started this year and competing teams could have up to 5 members, the trio decided to dedicate an average of 15 hours each per student to this annual March Break competition. In this game, competitors must reverse-engineer, break, hack, decrypt, and think creatively and critically to solve the challenges and capture the digital flags, which earned Team YYZ a remarkable score of 1,535 points.
