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Classroom Connection

A grade 12 Thornlea student, Maya Lekhi, has been selected to compete as a finalist in the 2022 Canada-Wide Science Fair! Every year, approximately half a million Canadian students in K-12 do a STEM project, fulfilling numerous learning outcomes and developing a range of competencies, including many associated with 21st Century "Deep Learning." About 25,000 participate in over 100 regional STEM fairs in every province and territory, where 450 CWSF finalists in grades 7-12/Cégep are selected. That puts CWSF finalists in the top 2% of STEM projects across the country – a significant achievement worthy of celebration.

Normally, the 2022 Canada-Wide Science Fair would be taking place at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton; however, due to COVID-19 restrictions, the event is being held virtually from May 16-20. The week long event includes ceremonies, keynote speakers, panel discussions, webinars with universities and colleges, exploring the other CWSF projects, visiting 66 STEM Expo exhibits, virtual STEM experiences at UNB, social activities, and more.

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
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
The Human Rights Committee's poster contest



College and University Applicants

- → Graduating students who plan to attend college or university in September should continue to check their OCAS and OUAC accounts and their email on a regular basis. College bound students should have received a response from the colleges that they applied to and can expect to receive communication about payment of fees, with mid-June being the earliest that colleges can require payment of tuition fees.
- → A reminder that all offers are CONDITIONAL upon the receipt of final grades in July students should continue to work hard to ensure the required final average.

University Applications:

Click on the link for **OUAC Important Dates - Jan - June 2022**

→ Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OUAC for university!

Your mid-term grades from semester two have been processed by OUAC and sent to the Universities to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OUAC does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OUAC/your Universities because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OUAC file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counselor as soon as possible to have it corrected.



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→ We highly recommend you accept your offer before the **deadline of June 1st**. You should be contacted by **May 27th** if you have been accepted into your program. The next OUAC transmission will be on **July 7th**.

→ University bound students should verify the deadline for <u>payment to secure a space in residence (usually June</u> 1st).

College Applications:

- → Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OCAS for college!
 - Your mid-term grades from semester two have been processed by OCAS and sent to the Colleges to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OCAS does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OCAS/your Colleges because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OCAS file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counselor as soon as possible to have it corrected.
- → The "Equal Consideration" Deadline for your Ontario College Application was February1st, 2022. Students can still apply. Please see your counselor if you need support.

Community Service Hours

We would also like to remind our learning community that there is a process in place for Community Service Hours. All graduating students must complete 20 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. It should be at a Not-For-Profit organization.
