MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Thornlea Families,

Here at Thornlea we continue to fix and change student timetables. Due to our growth, the school board has given us two new classes for periods two and four. Students are being added into those classes today. Priority is given to those students who have no classes during periods two and four. I still need to hire for those positions and we hope to have someone in place to teach those classes next Thursday. The enrollment of our school has increased from about 1,000 students to 1052 as of this morning. Our first priority was to create schedules for the 70 new students who registered at Thornlea. We are now working on grade 12 students and students who have a hole in their schedules. We know that a number of students have incomplete timetables for semester two. Those concerns will be addressed in January before semester two starts. We thank you for your understanding as we continue to work through issues with our new operating system.

I should be writing to tell you that our cafeteria is opening on Monday but that is not the case. We have now been informed that the earliest the cafeteria will reopen is the week of September 26 with some potential delays into the first week of October. We will let you know a firm date as soon as possible. Now time for a little good news. Our fall sports program is now underway with rugby, soccer, volleyball, tennis and cross country holding practices and tryouts. Our annual club fair will take place on Thursday September 22nd at lunch in the cafeteria. Students can walk around and see what clubs are running this year at school, meet the students running them and find out more about the individual clubs.

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Indigenous Languages and International Languages - Secondary Credit Programs

Dear Students and Families,

We welcome everyone to the 2022-2023 Indigenous Languages and International Languages (ILIL) program year and thank you for your continued support and patience.

During the pandemic, enrolment in the ILIL Credit program grew when compared to previous years. As a result, the program will remain in an online (remote) format. The program will be delivered virtually through synchronous learning, supported by asynchronous activities. Teachers will teach live language lessons in real time using Google Classroom to provide both synchronous and asynchronous learning opportunities during the regularly scheduled language classes. All program updates will be made on our <u>Board ILIL program homepage</u>.

Did you know there are many benefits to taking credit language courses?

- Students can take one International Languages Course as a Group 1 Compulsory or as an Elective Credit towards their Ontario Secondary Diploma.
- Students in the Secondary International Languages program can earn up to three credits towards graduation.
- If students earn a credit in the Level D (university) course, it can be used as one of their top six (6) marks for
 post-secondary entry. For example, if a student takes Spanish Level B, C and D, the student can submit their
 Level D mark as one of the top six marks for post-secondary applications.

If you have already registered for our fall programs, we thank you. Your registration will be moved to the same day on the online Site. No further action is required (e.g., if you originally registered for Greek for Richmond Hill H.S. then you will be automatically moved to the Saturday ILIL Online Site).
