Staff PA Day Plan for Friday, February 2, 2024

Length: Half Day - AM

Topic: Violence Prevention Training on Student Safety and Violent Incident Prevention

Presenter(s)/Facilitator(s): Online module developed by Board staff, facilitated by Administration.

Description: Staff will be engaging in learning related to:

- developing relationships and identity-affirming working and learning environments;
- identifying warning signs that a person's behaviour may be escalating;
- responding to escalations using specific strategies;
- exploring case studies;
- following reporting procedures; and accessing support and resources.

Topic: School teams will engage in School Improvement planning facilitated by school leaders. Topics will vary by subject and may include:

- preparation for Semester 2
- high yield instructional strategies in the de-streamed math, science, or English classroom
- data analysis for school improvement.

Presenter(s)/Facilitator(s): School Administration and Board based personnel

Description: Equitable assessment practices, MLL learning, and SIP/Department Meetings

Details: School teams will engage in School Improvement planning facilitated by school leaders. Topics will vary by subject and may include:

- embedding strategies to support teaching multilingual language learners into the curriculum
- embedding subject specific high yield strategies into instruction and assessment
- data analysis for school improvement.

School Teams will continue to engage in School Improvement Planning that supports the implementation of equitable assessment practices, curriculum changes and instructional strategies to support students in the de-streamed classroom.

- Summer school registration will open in late April, date to be announced.

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
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Night School

Night School registration for the Winter session is now open through my Pathway Planner and will close at noon on Thursday, February 1, 2024. It will re-open on Friday, February 2, 2024 and students can register in limited courses that show availability up until the second night of classes which is Tuesday, February 20, 2024.

Please be advised that our traditional in class face-to-face <u>Night School program</u> (Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:30 pm to 9:45 pm) will continue to use a remote learning delivery model. The program will be delivered virtually in real-time (synchronous).

The first night of class is Thursday, February 15, 2024 and the program ends Thursday, June 6, 2024. In order to help expedite the registration process, we ask that Guidance Counsellors approve course selections as soon as possible. Students who register prior to Thursday February 8, 2024 will receive a Welcome email. Students with unapproved course requests will not be registered.

Kindly note course offerings are not guaranteed as they are subject to sufficient enrolment and teacher availability. Should a course be cancelled, YRDSB students will receive an email through their gapps account while non YRDSB students will be contacted by phone. Kindly encourage students to check their gapps account or my Pathway Course Planner and visit our course offerings to see if their selected course has been cancelled.

We also ask that guidance counselors continue to monitor and keep track of those students who have signed up for a Night School course. Students are asked to update their guidance counselors if they are withdrawing from a course.

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<u>Vaccine Eligibility for Students - York Region Public Health</u>

On February 8th, 2024, YRPH will offer catch-up immunization clinics to students in grades 9 through 12 in the library of Thornlea Secondary School.

Ontario's <u>Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA)</u> requires students to be vaccinated against nine designated diseases or have a valid exemption. The immunization clinics are convenient opportunities for students to get caught up on missing vaccine doses prior to future school suspension campaigns.

Parents/students will be notified by mail in January of missing routine immunizations they are eligible to receive at their in-school immunization clinic in February. Also, students who missed an in-school clinic may visit their health care provider or book an appointment at a to obtain any missing routine immunizations. YRPH Clinic Locations

The parent/school letters sent out will also include a link to a <u>YRPH consent and Immunization Record Upload</u> and stored securely by YRPH. We will also post all immunization information about the high school clinics, including the e-consent form on york.ca/immunization.

Please make sure your child's consent was filled out at YRPH and are aware they will be receiving a vaccine on February 8th.

February 2024

As we start the second semester and second half of the school year, I want to take this opportunity to share some updates about upcoming dates, events and initiatives taking place across our system with you. I also want to thank everyone who contributes to building a strong educational community in York Region District School Board - the students, families, staff members and community partners who come together in support of student learning, achievement and well-being.

February is **Black History Month**. In addition to a number of <u>events taking place</u> within the school board and local community, the school board is once again Celebrating Black Excellence through its Black Voices campaign. <u>Black Voices</u> aims to centre and celebrate the Black members of our YRDSB community and share their voices. Later this month, we will also recognize the <u>Lunar New Year</u> and wish all students, staff and community celebrating Lunar New Year a happy and joyful celebration.

While we have seen milder **winter weather** this year, I also want to remind families that we have protocols in place for <u>severe weather</u> and school transportation cancellation in the case of inclement weather, and want to ensure families are aware. You can find more information on the Board website. We also continue to encourage families to use active school travel all year round, including during the winter months. Early in February, we will be celebrating **Winter Walk Day**, and be sharing tips as well as the benefits and joys of winter walking.

This month, students in Grades 5-12 will have an opportunity to vote in the **Student Trustee Elections.** I want to congratulate and thank all of the students in Grade 10 and 11 who applied for this position. Student Trustees play an important role representing student voice at the Board meetings and we greatly value their voice and contributions. Students who are eligible to vote will receive information in their GAPPS accounts about how to vote. This is a great opportunity to participate in the democratic process and to have their say about who will represent their voice in the next school year.

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Kindergarten and French Immersion registration opened in January for fall 2024. For students looking at course selection in secondary school, there are lots of great resources available at www.yrdsb.ca/experience-yrdsb that let students learn more about courses, programs and opportunities that relate to their interests.

You can also stay up-to-date with what's happening around the Board by visiting our newsroom - some of the latest stories feature schools in our area - or by listening to the Board's award-winning podcast Tune In YRDSB, including recent and upcoming episodes on what to expect in Kindergarten, how Student Trustees represent student voice, Tamil Heritage Month, Hindu Heritage Month and more.

As the governing body of the York Region District School Board, trustees are required to establish an annual **Multi-Year Strategic Plan (MYSP)** to guide system direction for a four-year period. The MYSP is a reflection of emergent priorities identified by our educational communities. Over the coming months, we will be conducting extensive consultations with YRDSB students, staff, families and community members to collect input and feedback to develop our revised MYSP. We look forward to hearing from you.
