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Message from our VP's.....

Dear Parents/guardians,

Guidance will be offering a workshop for Gr. 11 students on Tuesday Dec. 15 or Wednesday Dec. 16 from 3:20 to 4:00 pm. The workshop will provide information on Pathways and Sectors for Post-Secondary program. More information can be found on a Gr. 11 Guidance Google classroom. Please encourage your Gr. 11 student to join, if they are not part of this classroom. The code to join: **miroalj**

This workshop is also open to Gr. 10 students.

YRDSB is offering additional opportunities for students to earn their Gr. 11 and Gr. 12 credits through <u>Night School</u> and <u>Night School e-learning</u>. If your child is interested in taking one of these courses please connect with guidance through bit.ly/Thornlea or email their guidance counsellor directly. Night School registration will open on January 4th through myPathway planner. Night School e-learning registration opened on Dec. 7th and will stay open until February 10th, 2021.

Many post-secondary programs now require students to complete a supplementary application. A supplementary application can consist of a questionnaire similar to a resume (Queen's University Concurrent Education, <u>https://educ.queensu.ca/pse</u>) or specifically designated questions related to a discipline of a students' choice. Here is example of a supplementary question being asked this year by the University of Toronto, Commerce program, "*What accomplishments or endeavours outside of the classroom are you most proud of?*" (<u>https://rotmancommerce.utoronto.ca/future-students/our-supplemental-application/</u>. Another example of a supplementary can be a leadership profile and/ or writing exercise or a timed-video submission (York University, Schulich Bachelor of Business Administration program (<u>https://forms.schulich.yorku.ca/myfilestart</u>). The supplementary application deadlines vary from school to school. This year, some of the applications have an early deadline of December 10 or January 15th or a regular deadline of February 3, March 15 or March 31. We encourage students to set-up and check the university portals of their choice for more up-to-date information, once they apply through the Ontario Application Centre (OUAC).

OSSLT 2021 Update

In a recent memo, the Ministry of Education indicated that the literacy graduation requirement will be waived for all students graduating during the 2020-21 school year.

The Ministry is continuing to explore a field test of the online OSSLT in Spring 2021, which could allow the opportunity for non-graduating students to write the test and have successful attempts counted on their transcript. Further instructions on next steps regarding the online OSSLT in Spring 2021 will be forthcoming.

The government is providing financial support to help parents and guardians with additional costs during the 2020-2021 school year during the second wave of COVID-19.

Eligible parents or guardians will receive a one-time payment of:

- \$200 for each child up to age 12
- \$250 for each child or youth up to age 21 years with special needs

This is a new program, and all parents or guardians who are residents of Ontario with eligible children will need to submit a new application for each child.

2020-2021 Inclement Weather Day Procedure for Secondary Schools

The decision to declare an Inclement Weather day will be made by the Director of Education, or Designate in consultation with appropriate staff. The Director of Education is the only Board representative who may officially close a school for extreme circumstances.

This year, due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, our Inclement Weather Day Procedure has been adjusted based on direction from York Region Public Health.

In the event school bus transportation is cancelled local media will be notified by 6:00 a.m.

- All F2F elementary and secondary schools will be closed to students.
- All student learning will be remote.

• Student attendance will be recorded centrally, as students will be expected to log into their online classes through their appropriate Google classrooms.

F2F Secondary Schools:

• All credit classes will be taught synchronously on-line for the day (a change only for Block 1 as afternoon Block 2 – 4 classes are on-line).

• The schedule for the day will remain as is set.

• Teachers of Community Classes will provide asynchronous learning by posting/sharing age, grade, learning appropriate activities and/or assignments aligned with current student learning, while being available to students through the day as per their schedule.

Virtual Secondary School (SVS):

• Classes/courses will carry on as planned/scheduled, given they are already fully online.




Thornlea Science Fair
