Welcome to the start of a new semester from the Guidance Department! Our team has been busy with providing our students with timetable request changes for 2nd semester. We saw over 300 students requesting changes, and we tried our best to support each student's request.

We also would like to announce the process for making guidance appointments. **First**, please see Mrs. Burdett, our Guidance Secretary. If any student would like to make an appointment with their "area" identified counselor (French Immersion, ESL, Other), they should come to the Guidance Office before school starts (8:30 to 8:45), during their lunch (11:30 to 12:30), or after school (3:00 to 3:30) to make their appointment.

The Course Selection process for next year will begin on Monday February 11th. We will have our grade assemblies on this day to provide information on this process.

There will be grade assemblies on Monday Feb. 11th during Periods 1, 2, 3, and 4 to provide information on this process. Grade 9(Pd. 1), Grade 10(Pd. 2), Grade 12(Pd. 3), Grade 11(Pd. 4). Course selections in myBlueprint are to be completed and submitted by Friday Feb. 22nd this is the Equal Consideration Deadline.

After students have selected their courses, they must click SUBMIT, and then PRINT, then get it SIGNED by a parent/guardian. Then they need to hand it in to their HOMEROOM teacher before Wednesday Feb. 27th; or if they have a spare period 1, to the Guidance Department. Thank you.

Please make sure your child submits a signed course selection form to their Homeroom Teacher or the Guidance Department.

The Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) deadline has now passed. Currently 198 Thornlea students have applied. We wish them all the best and will continue to answer their questions on the University selection process. The next marks transmission for OUAC will be on **April 25th**.

Guidance will continue to monitor and support the College application process. Currently, 15 Thornlea students have applied. No PinCodes are distributed for College Applications; students will create their own on-line at www.ontariocolleges.ca.

Please note that the "equal consideration" deadline has passed (Feb. 1st), **but students can still apply**. The next marks transmission for OCAS will be on **April 25th**.

Guidance already offered a College application seminar. If you need further assistance please see Ms. Lovleen Rai in the Guidance Office.

Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied to OUAC for university and OCAS for College.

Your grades from semester one have been processed by OUAC and OCAS and sent to the Universities and Colleges to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OUAC does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OUAC/your Universities because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OUAC file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counsellor as soon as possible to have it corrected.

College and University Spring Open Houses are a popular way for prospective students to visit various Post-Secondary Institutions and evaluate them prior to applying and/or choosing. It is never too early to begin the search. The Guidance Department encourages all students, especially in grades 11 and 12 to attend the open house program of any potential future University/College. Please visit the University/College website to confirm Open House schedules during March Break. Spaces can be limited.

Community Service Hours

We would also like to remind our learning community that there is a process in place for Community Service Hours. All students must complete 40 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. Please see your counselor for pre-approval. It should be at a Not-For-Profit organization.

We also would like to announce the approved initiative to all our **grade 9** students. Grade 9 students that complete their 40 community service hours in their grade 9 year will receive a special certificate of completion. This is for grade 9's only. The 40 hours must be submitted into our Guidance Office by **Friday June 21st to Qualify.**

For more information on volunteer opportunities, please come down to the Guidance Office and pick up a Community Service Hours form and please take a look at our "Volunteer Bulletin Board" for opportunities to fulfill this Ministry of Education graduation requirement.

A reminder to all grade 12 students; that they should hand in their community service hours ASAP. Before the next OUAC/OCAS transmission.

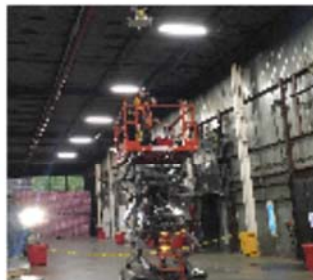

A Fast Track to Skilled Trades

Thornlea's Exploring Opportunities Program (EOP)

In Canada, skilled trades are approaching a vital period in expansion. Statisticians believe the skilled trade workforce is approaching a “demographic deficit – the number of those about to retire exceeds new entrants into those important professions” (Robinson 2017). Parents and students need to consider the demand of skilled trades, the perk of obtaining education and working concurrently, and the satisfaction of these highly technical and evolving jobs. The days of having ‘weak’ students enter trades is long gone. As you read this, contemplate that person you know that can solve problems at ease, pick up highly technical terms effortlessly, or one who dismantles everything to see how it works; employers of various skilled trades are seeking these individuals and will offer the education to be extremely successful and respected. More importantly, “in Canada’s future economy, the skilled trades are going to matter more than ever. So we need to make significant and sustained investments in attracting our best and brightest talent to these professions, the same way we do for the best and brightest knowledge workers” (Buck 2014).



For those who have never heard the saying ‘practice makes perfect’, this message applies to you more than anyone! Thornlea’s Exploring Opportunities Program (EOP), concentrated in Transportation Technology, is offered to Gr.11 students who strive for exposure to experiential learning. EOP stands as the premier program advancing and catering to students that want to learn and, more importantly, *do*. To elaborate, EOP runs two semesters – one in Gr.11 and one in Gr.12.

During either grade level, students involved in EOP will not only gain educational training in our updated automotive technology facility, but will have the chance to experience trades in the 'real world' through a Co-op placement. After completion, students involved in EOP will graduate with valuable industry education, experience, and potentially an apprenticeship.
