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# Message from our Administration

Dear Parents/guardians,

Welcome 2021! 2020 was exceptionally challenging and we want to thank all our students and families for their resiliency and creativity. We wish everyone a happy and a healthy new year!

We are currently in rotation #8 for the Thornlea's adaptive model. A reminder to all our families that the morning session of the adaptive model is for both cohorts and takes place from 8:50 – 11:20 am every morning. Rotation #8 will end on January 29.

#### **Timetables for Semester 2**

The board has determined the number of students that will be attending Thornlea's adaptive model for semester 2. Based on this number Thornlea's teaching sections have been cut by 49. Having carefully reviewed our students' academic needs and pathway aspirations, we have created a new timetable for semester 2. During the last two weeks, guidance and administration have been diligently working to timetable students into their requested courses and to address all requests. On Friday January 22, timetables will be shared with students via teach assist and via additional email.

On Monday, January 25<sup>th</sup> we will open the process for timetable changes and share with you a new bit.ly link for students to submit their timetable requests.

To help with timetable needs of all students in YRDSB the board is offering additional opportunities for students to earn their Gr. 11 and Gr. 12 credits through <u>Night School</u> and <u>Night School e-learning</u> and <u>Day School e-learning</u>. If your child is interested in taking one of these courses please connect with guidance through bit.ly/Thornlea or email their guidance counsellor directly. Night School registration has opened on January 4<sup>th</sup> through myPathway planner. Night School e-learning registration opened on Dec. 7<sup>th</sup> and will stay open until February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

#### Course selection for 2021-2022 academic year

We wanted to let you know that our Course Selection process this year will once again take place through our interactive online education and career/life planning platform called myBlueprint.

Choosing the right courses is very important – especially because students are prompted to think about their career aspirations and acquire new skills and knowledge through a variety of elective courses that we offer at Thorlea. Course selection may also be the time to have a discussion with your child on where they are most engaged in their learning and where they see themselves in a year from now. Guidance recognizes that choosing courses may be stressful for you and your child and is available to answer questions and help in this process.

Guidance will host virtual grade specific presentations during the month of February to help our students navigate the course selection process. Regardless of whether your child is attending the Thornlea's adaptive model of virtual school, these presentations are important to attend.
