Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) & College Application Process

The Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) deadline has now passed. Currently, 201 Thornlea students have applied. We wish them all the best and we will continue to answer their questions on the University selection process.

Guidance will continue to monitor and support the College application process. Currently, 30 Thornlea students have applied. No PinCodes are distributed for College Applications, as students will create their own on -line at www.ontariocolleges.ca.

Please note that the "equal consideration" deadline has passed (Feb. 1st), but students can still apply.

The Guidance Team has already conducted two virtual seminars to review college application details. If you need further assistance, please email your counselor.

Final marks were automatically sent to Ontario Universities and Colleges from the School.

CHECK YOUR ACCOUNT TODAY for <u>ACCURACY!</u> If you think there is something wrong – email Mr. Alkins immediately.

Your grades from semester one have been processed on Feb. 17th by OUAC and OCAS and sent to the Universities and Colleges to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OUAC does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OUAC/your Universities because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OUAC file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counsellor as soon as possible to have it corrected.

College and University VIRTUAL Spring Open Houses are a popular way for prospective students to visit various Post-Secondary Institutions and evaluate them prior to accepting an offer. It is never too early or late to begin the search. The Guidance Department encourages all students, especially in grades 11 and 12 to attend the VIRTUAL open house program of any potential future University/College. Please visit the University/College website to confirm VIRTUAL Open House schedules.

Community Service Hours

We would also like to remind our learning community that there is a process in place for Community Service Hours. All students must complete 40 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. Please see your counselor for pre-approval. It should be at a Not-For-Profit organization.

A reminder to all grade 12 students; that they should hand in their community service hours ASAP. Due to the pandemic – graduating students only require <u>20 hours</u> this school year.




Pre-AP and AP Art Portfolio Workshops for Grade 111-12 students

Report It

Our schools should be safe, welcoming and inclusive places for everyone. It is important that students know what to do if they witness or experience inappropriate behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination.

- There may be situations when you can safely step in and intervene and help.
- Talk to an adult at school, family member or other trusted adult.

Report the event without the person involved knowing using our online reporting tool, Report It.

Report It lets you share information about inappropriate student behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination. You can use the online form to report:

• bullying, drugs, cheating, vandalism, harassment, violence or any other inappropriate behaviour

incidents of discrimination or hate, including anti-Indigenous racism, ableism, anti-Asian racism, anti-Black racism, antisemitism, classism, homophobia, Islamaphobia, sexism, transphobia or other forms of hate

You can report events that happen at school, at school-related events, online or off school property if it negatively affects a student or the school climate. You can also choose to make a report anonymously.

Complete reports are shared with the school to investigate and respond.

Acts of discrimination, hate and bullying are never acceptable. Using the Report It tool is a way of standing up for each other and for ourselves.
