Dear Families and Community Members,

Second semester has been off to a great start as all students settle into the routine of their classes this semester. Any student timetable issues should have been resolved. If there are still concerns with timetables, students may see Guidance or speak to an administrator in the main office. Semester one report cards were sent home yesterday. Students who were absent or have a spare may come to the main office to get a copy of their report cards.

There's been some great accomplishments in athletics at Thornlea Secondary School. The junior girls volley-ball team is currently sitting in 4th place in Tier 1 with two regular season games left to play before playoffs. Playoffs will be held on February 12th - Go Thunder! At the YRAA Championship Swim Meet in December, Brynn Armstrong and Meredith Liu both qualified for OFSAA provincials to be held at the Toronto Pan Am Sports Centre in March. Here are the specifics of their YRAA finishes: Brynn Armstrong: 1st place finish in 100 metre butterfly which is a top in York Region! Meredith Liu: 1st place finish in 200 metre individual medley which is also a top in York Region! She also had a 3rd place finish in 200 metre freestyle which was fast enough to qualify for provincials! Overall, the team did really well this year. Lots of veteran swimmers continued to do well and helped train the novices. Thanks to Brynn, who volunteered to share her expertise by helping coach the team, and also to Ms. Emily O'Connor who also lent a hand!

As we begin semester two, it's time to start thinking about the upcoming 2020/2021 school year. On February 10th-12th, Guidance will be conducting grade-specific course selection assemblies during which time they will guide students through the process and timelines of selecting courses for the next school year. As a reminder, all course selections will take place on myBlueprint.ca. Students can submit their course selections on the site February 12th-24th. As we enter another month of winter, this is a good time to be thinking about our health, well-being and the importance of self-care. We know that, like all of us, our students can focus better when they feel better. Our schools play an important role in health and mental health promotion and education, and fostering well-being and mental health is one of our <u>priorities as a school board</u>.

There is a lot of work taking place in our schools and board to create <u>healthy schools</u> and promote <u>mental</u> <u>health</u> and well-being, including:

Providing training and resources for educators on strategies to support mentally healthy classrooms for all students, including holding a mental health conference.

Hiring identity specific mental health workers and developing partnerships with <u>community partners</u> to serve the diverse needs of our students.

Developing a <u>Student Suicide Intervention Protocol</u> to help keep students safe in the event of suicidal thoughts or actions.

Educating students about the risks of <u>substance use and misuse</u>, including <u>vaping</u> and <u>cannabis</u>.

Providing strategies and supports for students in preparing for exams and managing stress.

This commitment is also reflected in Board policy like the <u>Healthy Schools and Workplaces</u> policy and procedures. Setting policy, which governs the operation of the Board, is one of the <u>roles of trustees</u>, and we greatly value the input provided by students, staff members, family and community members. I encourage you to look at the <u>policies under review</u> and share your feedback.

We have a lot to look forward to in 2020. At the Board meeting in December, trustees unanimously approved the addition of <u>new permanent Indigenous Trustee and Indigenous Student Trustee positions</u>. We are committed to Indigenous Education in our Board and it is important that these voices are represented at the table. We hope to fill the positions as soon as possible and will share more information as it becomes available.

Bus or School Cancellations

With winter weather already here, we want to share some important reminders for families.

When an **inclement weather** or **extreme cold** or day is declared, school transportation (including buses and taxis) are cancelled in the morning and afternoon. Schools will remain open. If you drive your child to school, or your child takes alternate transportation, you must make arrangements for your child to get home at the end of the day. Please call the school if your child will not be attending school on those days. Students will not be penalized for missing school on these days.

There may be rare instances when **emergency winter events** occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure.
