

Salutations from the Guidance Department! Our team has been very busy since registration day on August 31st. We would like to thank you for your patience in our efforts to support your child for this school year. The Guidance Team this year consists of Ms. Lovleen Rai (ESL Counselor/Literacy Lead), Ms. Viviane Estafanos (French Immersion Counselor/F.I. Teacher), Ms. Julie Scott (Student Success), Ms. Kathryn Pantazopoulos (Student Success for ESL students), Mr. Nizam Alkins, Head of Guidance (Counselor) and Ms. Gail Burdett (Guidance Secretary).

The team has been trying its best to support every student that “requests” a timetable change this school year. To date, we have seen approximately 200 grade 12 students, 125 grade 11 students, 80 grade 10 students, 30 grade 9 students, 75 new international visa students, and 30 new registrations. This process was completed on Friday Sept. 15th. We thank you for your patience and understanding through this busy time.

We also would like to announce the new process for making guidance appointments. **First**, please see Mrs. Burdett, our Guidance Secretary. If any student would like to make an appointment with their “area” identified counselor (French Immersion, ESL, Other), they should come to the Guidance Office before school starts (8:30 to 8:45), during their lunch (11:30 to 12:30), or after school (3:00 to 3:30) to make their appointment.

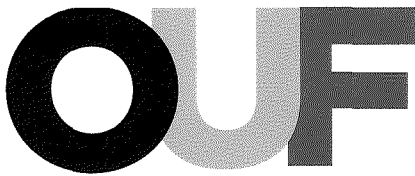

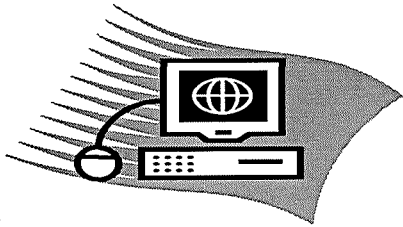

About Applying Online to an Ontario University

Applying Online:

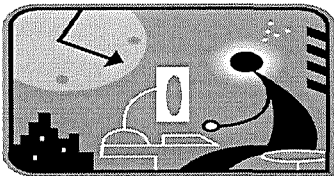
- Before applying you need your PIN. This will be available by **November**, in Guidance. Listen for announcements about when they will be available.
- APPLICATION WEBSITE: <http://www.ouac.on.ca>
- Applicants will apply online using the Secondary School Online Application (SSOLA) called COMPASS.101
- OUAC will retransmit your application data to the universities ***as soon as your payment is received***
- Once you have submitted your online application, you will be able to review and make changes to your application using your OUAC Access Code.



Number of Universities:

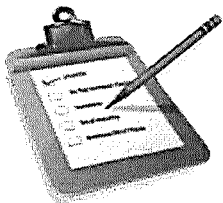
- You can choose to apply to as many universities as you wish, but you may only select a maximum of three programs at any one university (including affiliates)
- Basic fee of \$150.00 pays for 3 choices, but you can pay an additional fee of \$50.00 for each additional choice

Timelines:



As soon as possible	Begin researching your university programs – make sure to research your program choice as well as alternative back up programs.
Early fall	Pick up a copy of the eINFO postcard to the www.electronicinfo.ca website.
November 9, 2017	Schools forward electronic data files to OUAC for all possible university candidates. Grade 11 and 12 final grades and the list of your courses this year.
Late November	OUAC Access Codes (PIN NUMBERS) will be distributed by Guidance. Use the online version of the COMPASS.101 Companion Booklet to find the codes for university programs.
December	You are strongly encouraged to apply in December. Immediately after you submit your application, you will receive your OUAC Reference Number – Record this 11 digit number. On the same screen, you will be prompted to change your PIN to a Personal Password. Don't forget it. Save it in your phone.
After you apply	When you receive your Acknowledgement Letter, go to the Review and Change Your Completed Application tool at OUAC. Check that the information is correct. You can change your personal information and program choices online. If there is a problem with your academic information, please see your Guidance Counselor.
January 17 th , 2018	This is the deadline for students to submit online applications for OUAC. You must pay in full for the application to be complete.
February 6 th , 2018	This the recommended last date for students to submit all information to OUAC including university and program changes as well as additional choices to be eligible for early admission. This is not a deadline; changes will be accepted and processed by OUAC at any time.
February 15, 2018	Schools will forward your electronic data files (including marks) to OUAC. It is essential that your review all academic information to ensure accuracy.
April 26, 2018	Schools will forward your electronic data files (including marks) to OUAC.
Mid Feb – May	Ontario Universities may begin to make early conditional offers of admission, including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives and offers of residence.
May 29 th , 2018	This is the date by which all applicants shall expect a response from an Ontario university. Such a response will be one of: 1) an offer of admission 2) a refusal 3) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information
June 1 st , 2018	This is the earliest date by which Ontario universities may require a response to an offer of admission. It is understood that students who choose to respond by this deadline may subsequently amend their confirmations to another university or program without penalty until May 29 th , 2016. This is the earliest date at which an Ontario university may require a financial commitment of any kind (registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.)
July 5 th , 2018	Schools will forward your electronic data files (including marks) to OUAC

Information You Will Need With You When Applying:



- Your OUAC Access Codes (your school number, your student number, and your personal identification number (PIN), which will be distributed by Guidance
- Personal Data (**legal name** (as per school records), address, date of birth, telephone number)
- Valid Email address (optional)
- Social Insurance Number (SIN) – you may apply without a SIN number, but you must submit a SIN number if you wish to receive an income tax credit for your university tuition
- Status in Canada (Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident / Landed Immigrant, Student Authorization / Visa Student, Other). If you were not born in Canada, you will need to know the year and month that you arrived in Canada.
- Method of Payment (on line banking, online credit card, certified cheque or money order, credit card by phone or a mail – in credit card form).
- Your university program choices (code, university, program, subject of major interest (if applies))

Changing Schools Mid-Year

If you already have OUAC Access Codes, you must arrange for your new school to inform OUAC about the changes of high school. This will ensure that your academic data is sent to OUAC.

Attending a Private School to Earn Credits?

The private school must submit your mid-term marks directly to OUAC.

When you have earned the credit bring an official transcript or report card to Guidance so the information can be added to your Transcript in Trillium. The final marks will be included with the regular electronic data files sent to OUAC.

Secondary School Application (OUAC 101) 2017-2018 Schedule of Dates

Final version: April 21, 2017

Late August

The OUAC circulates eINFO flyers and launches eINFO: www.electronicinfo.ca.

August 21, 2017

The OUAC starts distributing 101 application materials to Ontario high schools and school boards.

November 9, 2017

Deadline for the OUAC to receive all electronic student data files from Ontario high schools.

January 17, 2018

Deadline for Ontario high school students to submit their completed application to the OUAC.

Note: The OUAC still processes applications received after this date and distributes them to the universities; however, specific university deadlines will apply.

The initial application includes all final grades from completed Grade 11 and 12 courses and a list of all current-year courses in progress.

January 25, 2018

Target date for Ontario universities to receive all application data and grades from the OUAC for applications submitted by January 17, 2018.

February 6, 2018

Recommended last date for students to submit all information to the OUAC to be considered for early admission. This information includes university and program changes and additional active choices.

Note: This is a recommended deadline. The OUAC will still accept and process application changes at any time.

February 15, 2018

Deadline for the OUAC to receive all final first-semester grades and current full-year grades for 4U/M courses from Ontario high schools.

March 2, 2018

Target date for Ontario universities to receive all final first-semester grades and current full-year grades for 4U/M courses from the OUAC.

April 26, 2018

Deadline for Ontario high schools to report midterm grades for second-semester courses and interim grades for full-year courses to the OUAC. Grades that the OUAC receives earlier than the deadline will be sent to Ontario universities when received.

May 8, 2018

Target date for Ontario universities to receive second-semester midterm grades and interim grades for full-year courses from the OUAC. Grades that the OUAC receives earlier than the deadline will be sent to Ontario universities when received.

May 29, 2018

The latest date all high school applicants can expect a response from an Ontario university. This includes:

1. an offer of admission;
2. a refusal; or
3. a deferral, once additional information is received.

June 1, 2018

The earliest date an Ontario high school student may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.).

All other admissions-related elements, including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives, and offers of residence are considered part of the offer of admission. Therefore, a student may accept these other offers before June 1, 2017, but Ontario universities will not compel a student in any way to make a decision earlier than this date.

July 5, 2018

Deadline for the OUAC to receive final grades for current semester/year courses from Ontario high schools.

July 12, 2018

Target date for the OUAC to send all **remaining** final grades to the universities. The OUAC will attempt to contact all schools that have not provided their grades.

August 1-31, 2018

The OUAC collects summer school grades from Ontario high schools and boards.

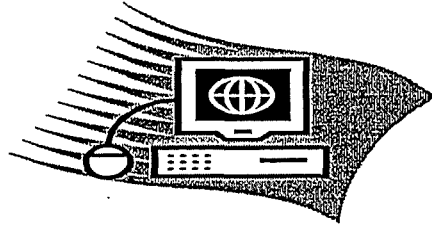

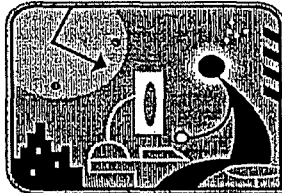
About Applying Online to an Ontario College

Applying Online:



- APPLICATION WEBSITE: <http://www.ontariocolleges.ca>
- Everyone can apply online without needing to acquire an access/Pin code
- The first time you log in, create a User Account "Apply Now" link – Use your Legal Name that is on the school records
- Record the User Name and Password that you have selected as you will use them to access you application each time you log on
- You will receive a unique OCAS Number, record it
- By mid-November, your school will have already submitted a transcript for you. *Once you have paid your fees* and received your Verification Form from OCAS, you will be able to go to the OCAS site, choose My Application, login to your account and review your academic information under the heading Information-Grades

As soon as possible	Begin researching your college programs – make sure to research your program of choice as well as alternative back up programs.
October 24&25, 2017	Visit the Ontario College Information Fair: Enercare Centre @ Exhibition Place
November 20-24, 2017	Schools will forward electronic data files to OCAS for all possible college applicants. Semester 1 mid-term marks are included.
December	You are strongly advised to apply well before the February due date. Once your application has been processed, OCAS will send you a verification form confirming your information.
After you apply	When you receive your verification form, login to your OCAS account and check the information that is in your account. You can correct your personal information and change your choices online by using the My Application link on the OCAS site.
Before Feb. 1 st , 2018	To ensure equal consideration, all college applications must be received by OCAS before February 1 st
February 1 st	This is the earliest date for the first release of admission decisions by the colleges. Colleges will continue to offer admissions until all places in the programs are filled.
After February 1 st	You are still able to apply online and you are still able to make changes to your college and program choices, BUT after February 1 st applications are on a first come, first serve basis. You can also make changes by phoning OCAS at 1-888-892-2228. Earliest release of offers by colleges to all applicants. Offers will continue to be issues until programs are filled or wit-lists are established.
February 9, 2018	Schools will forward your electronic data files (including Semester 1 final marks) to OCAS.
Late February	Login to your OCAS account by following the My Application link on the OCAS website and go to Information-Grades to check that the grades in your account are correct for your current courses. If there is a problem, see your Guidance Counselor.
April 23-27	Your school will forward your electronic data files (including Semester 2 mid-term marks) to OCAS.
May 1 st , 2018	Applicants must confirm their acceptance to an offer of admission to their chosen college through www.ontariocolleges.ca After this date, colleges will determine the date the confirmation is due.
June 15 th , 2018	Earliest date that colleges require payment of tuition fees.
July 6, 2018	Your school will forward your electronic data files (including final marks) to OCAS

Information You Will Need With You When Applying:



- Demographic data (Legal name, address, postal code, date of birth, telephone number)
- Valid email address
- Ontario Education Number (OEN) – found on your report card or transcript or credit counseling summary
- Status in Canada (Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident/Landed Immigrant, Student Authorization/Visa Student, Other). If you were not born in Canada, you will need to know the year and the month that you arrived in Canada.
- Method of Payment (online banking, online credit card, certified cheque or money order, credit card by phone or a mail in credit card form, VISA, Mastercard or American Express)
- Non-refundable application fee: \$95.00
- Your college and program choices – up to five choices with a maximum of three choices for any one college (college code, program code, campus code, start date year/month)
- Pen and paper to record your Username, Password, and OCAS Number – **SAVE IT IN YOUR PHONE**

Changing Schools Mid-Year:

You must arrange for your new school to inform OCAS about the change of high school. This will ensure that your academic data is sent to OCAS.

Important Dates and Deadlines for Ontario College Applications

When to Apply

As long as space remains in an Ontario college program, you may apply for it. However, there are some important dates to keep in mind, especially for popular programs that fill up quickly.

Apply to college as soon as the online application becomes available in October. Complete and pay for your application on or before **February 1 in order to receive equal consideration for admission (/apply/important-dates#ecd)** to programs beginning the following September.

The following dates apply to programs starting in the fall of 2018. The application process at ontariocolleges.ca follows an annual cycle, based on the academic year (August to July). For programs beginning at other times of the year, please **contact the individual colleges (/colleges/contact-the-colleges)** for more information about application processing dates.

ontariocolleges.ca Applying To College - Fou...

Early October 2017: Online Application Opens

In early October, access to the online college application becomes available for programs beginning in the following academic year (August to July). You may create an account and **begin your application (/apply)**.

October 15, 2017: Colleges Begin Receiving Applications

In mid-October, ontariocolleges.ca begins transmitting application data to the colleges for the following academic year (August to July). This is the earliest date that colleges may acknowledge applications.

February 1, 2018: Equal Consideration Date

Apply on or before this date in order to receive equal consideration for admission to programs starting the following fall. After this date, colleges consider applicants on a first-come, first-served basis until programs are full.

Note that applications to Highly Competitive Programs (/apply/highly-competitive-programs) must be received by this date in order to be considered. As these programs receive a high volume of applicants, all seats may be filled by February 1.

Applicants are encouraged to complete their applications well before the Equal Consideration Date, as website volumes on the online application are at their highest at this time.

Many programs continue to accept applicants after February 1. Use our **Find a Program (/.../FindProgram)** tool at any time to find programs that are still open.



February 1, 2018: Earliest Offer Date

This is the earliest date that colleges may begin to send offers of admission to programs for the upcoming academic year. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or wait-lists are established.

May 1, 2018: Deadline to Confirm Offers of Admission

Applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of admission by this date. Log in to your ontariocolleges.ca account to **confirm your offer (/apply/offers-of-admission)**.

Colleges may extend offers of admission after this date. Each college will set the deadline to confirm offers made after May 1, and this deadline will be communicated to you with your offer.

Mid-June 2018: Tuition Deposit Due at the Colleges

The colleges require payment of a tuition deposit in mid-June to secure your spot in your program. Each college sets its own tuition deposit amount and payment deadline. This information will be communicated to you by the college.
