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MESSAGE FROM VICE-PRINCIPAL

Dear Families and Community Members,

As you read this letter, the first semester is quickly wrapping up with only a few days of classes left before the final examination period. As students and staff wrap up courses for the semester, we look back at a wonderful semester filled with a lot of highlights for students through their extra-curricular activities at school.

A reminder to parents/guardians that tonight's School Council meeting has been cancelled and postponed to tomorrow at 7:15pm in the library. If you are available, please come and attend. All are welcome.

For students applying to college, the Equal Consideration deadline is February 1st. Please see Guidance if you have any questions.

There are a few important dates and events for parents to be aware of. Thursday February 1st will be the exam review day when students will have the opportunity to view their exam and obtain their final marks for their first semester courses. With courses that didn't have an exam, students will have the time to discuss the culminating course assignments with their teachers. Students will also be receiving their semester two timetable during period one (homeroom) of the exam review day. Friday February 2nd will be a PA Day and semester two will officially begin on Monday February 5th. On February 8th, semester one report cards will be distributed to students to take home during their period one class. The picture day for semester two will take place on February 15th. Family Day will be taking place on February 19th and as a result there won't be any classes on that day. The next School Council meeting will take place on February ary 21st.

Looking ahead to the beginning of semester two, students will be selecting their courses for the 2018/2019 school year. It would be a great idea for students and parents to look at the online Thornlea Secondary School course calendar and to log on Career Cruising and plan for the upcoming school year. The guidance department will be having course selection assemblies during the beginning of February to assist students with this process. If you have specific questions about pathway options and about courses, students can make an appointment with their guidance coursellor.

The drama department and students will be beginning to plan and prepare for the one act festival which will be something you don't want to miss.

With report cards coming home, this is a good time of year to review your child's progress and to set goals for the rest of the school year.

As trustees, our goals are set out in the Board <u>Multi-Year Plan</u>. In the coming months, trustees will be reviewing and updating this plan. This process will include opportunities for public input, and trustees will be out in the communities talking about this. More information will be shared about this in the spring.

Developing and reviewing the Multi-Year Plan is just one of our responsibilities as publicly elected officials. Trustee responsibilities also include hiring the Director of Education, setting <u>Board policies</u> and the <u>annual</u> <u>budget</u>, and communicating with the public.

This is a good time to learn more about the <u>role of trustees</u> with the next <u>municipal election</u> taking place later this year on October 22, 2018. York Region District School Board has <u>12 trustees</u>, elected by ratepayers. As a trustee, listening and communicating with families is an important part of my role. Students, families and members of the public are welcome to attend and observe any public Board, Advisory or Board Committee meetings and to share their views with us on policy and Board governance.

As we move into the second half of the year, I hope that you are seeing evidence of your child's learning and progress, and finding opportunities to get involved in their learning and the life of the school.





Happy New Year from the Guidance Department!

Our team has been busy with providing our students with information about the University and College Application process, scholarship and community involvement hours and timetable requests for 2nd semester.

The Guidance Team this year consists of Ms. Lovleen Rai (ESL Counselor/Literacy Lead), Ms. Viviane Estafanos (French Immersion Counselor/AP Co-oridnator, F.I. Teacher), Ms. Julie Scott (Student Success), Ms. Kathryn Pantazopoulos(Student Success for ESL students). Mr. Nizam Alkins, Head of Guidance (Counselor) and Ms. Gail Burdett (Guidance Secretary).

We also would like to announce the new process for making guidance appointments. **First**, please see Mrs. Burdett, our Guidance Secretary. If any student would like to make an appointment with their "area" identified counselor (French Immersion, ESL, Other), they should come to the Guidance Office before school starts (8:30 to 8:45), during their lunch (11:30 to 12:30), or after school (3:00 to 3:30) to make their appointment.

The Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) deadline has now passed. Currently <u>197</u> Thornlea students have applied. We wish them all the best in their exams next week and will continue to answer their questions on the University selection process. Note: Our Guidance Department will upload your grade 12 Marks in early February. No marks will be submitted to OUAC until that time.

Guidance will continue to monitor and support the College application process. We have had **<u>26</u>** students apply as of today. No PinCodes are distributed for College Applications; students will create their own on-line at <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>.

The "Equal Consideration" Deadline for your College Application is February1st, 2018 (recommend to pay on-line with a credit card)

The next OUAC University grades transmission is scheduled for February 15th, 2018. The next OCAS College grades transmission is scheduled for February 9th, 2018.

If students are planning on making a request for a timetable change for 2nd semester, a "request to make a change" form will be handed out by the Guidance Office starting <u>Feb. 5th</u>. Listen for your Grade level to be called down to the Guidance Office on <u>Feb. 5th</u>.

<u>Course selections</u> for next year 2018/19, will start on Tuesday <u>February 6th</u>. There will be grade assemblies during <u>Period 2</u> to provide information on this process. Grade 9 (Feb 6), Grade 10(Feb. 7), Grade 11(Feb. 8), Grade 12(Feb. 9). <u>Course selections in Carreer Cruising are to be completed and submitted by Friday Feb. 23^{rd (equal consideration deadline)}.</u>

We would also like to remind our learning community that there is a new process in place for Community Service Hours. All students must complete 40 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. Please see your counselor for approval. Your service must be for a <u>Not-For-Profit</u> organization/event.

We also would like to announce a new initiative to all our grade 9 students. Grade 9 students that complete their 40 community service hours in their grade 9 year will receive a special certificate of completion.

For more information on volunteer opportunities, please come down to the Guidance Office and pick up a Community Service Hours form and please take a look at our "Volunteer Bulletin Board" for current opportunities to fulfill this Ministry of Education requirement.

A reminder to all grade 12 students; that they should hand in their community service hours by January 31st^h, 2018. Before the next OUAC/OCAS transmission.




