Advanced Placement (AP)

Studio Art

at Thornlea Secondary School

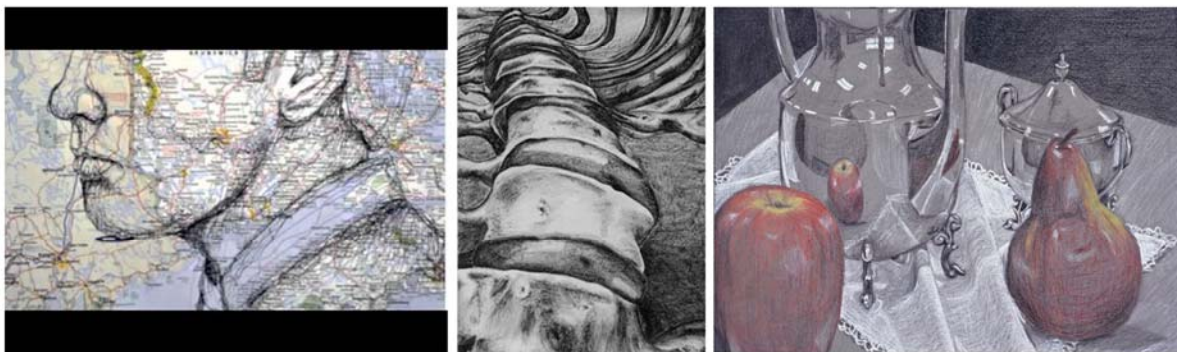
Thornlea Secondary School is currently the only school in York Region to offer AP Studio Art. Students can select the course for their grade 12 year. Once the course begins students decide whether to focus on a Painting/Drawing Portfolio or a 2D Design Portfolio. Painting/Drawing can include any paint or drawing material such as acrylic paint, watercolour, charcoal, graphite, pastel. The 2D Design portfolio can also use those materials but in addition students can incorporate mixed media work, digital work, and photography.

The first half of the course focuses on the Breadth aspect of the portfolio -students work in a wide range of styles and materials to show their breadth of skills. The second half of the course focuses on the Concentration part of the portfolio where students choose a topic and subject matter to focus on for a series of artworks, to show they can use art materials to deeply examine a topic of their choice.

Students use class time to work on their portfolios and develop their skills. They earn a mark from the Thornlea teacher but also submit their Portfolio to the AP College Board. Portfolios are due the beginning of May. Five pieces are sent to the AP College Board for evaluation. The other pieces are submitted electronically with short artist statements. Students are scored out of 6. If students earn a score of 4 or higher they may be eligible for a university credit.

AP Studio Art is an excellent opportunity for students who want to take a semester to focus on developing their artistic abilities, build a portfolio, and earn an AP credit which although rigorous is deeply rewarding.

Happy New Year from the Guidance Department!

A reminder that the Guidance Team, starting Feb. 6th, the department consists of: Mr. Paul Stephenson (Counselor/Student Success), Mr. Nizam Alkins, Head of Guidance (Counselor) and Ms. Gail Burdett (Guidance Secretary).

Our team has been busy providing our students with information about the University and College Application process, scholarship opportunities, community involvement hours and timetable requests for 2nd semester.

The Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) deadline has now passed. Currently 165 Thornlea students have applied. We wish them all the best in their exams and will continue to answer their questions on the University selection process.

Guidance has offered several College Application work-shops. No Pin Codes are distributed for College Applications; students will create their own with their Ontario Education Number (OEN) at www.ontariocolleges.ca. A reminder that the “equal consideration” **deadline** is **February 1st**.

Final marks will be automatically sent to Ontario Universities and Colleges from the School.

The next OUAC University grades transmission is scheduled for February 15th, 2017. The next OCAS College grades transmission is scheduled for February 10th, 2017.

Course selections for next year will start on Wednesday February 13th. There will be grade assemblies during period 2 to provide information on this process. Grade 9(Feb 13), Grade 10(Feb. 14), Grade 11(Feb. 15), Grade 12(Feb. 16). Course selections in Career Cruising are to be completed and submitted by Friday Feb. 24th.

If students are planning on making a request for a timetable change for 2nd semester, listen to the announcements on Feb. 6th. The process will be the same as in September.

We also would like to remind students of our process for making guidance appointments. If any student would like to make an appointment with their “Alpha/Program” identified counselor, they should come to the Guidance Office before school starts (8:25 to 8:45), during their lunch (11:30 to 12:30), or after school (3:05 to 3:30).

We would also like to remind students that there is a new process in place for Community Service Hours (CSH). All students must complete 40 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. Please see your counselor for a CSH sheet and pre-approval. ***A reminder to all grade 12 students; that they should hand in their community service hours by Thursday, February 9th, 2017.***
