### Message from our Trustee

One of our goals in the <u>Trustees' Multi-Year Plan</u> is to "continuously increase student achievement and well-being through a culture and caring and learning." That includes a culture that emphasizes engagement and positive relationships among all the members of the school community – students, staff members, families and community members.

You, as parents/guardians, are our most important partners when it comes to education. The support you have provided to your child throughout this past school year will help to strengthen our schools and make a difference to your child's learning.

I encourage you to continue engaging your child in learning throughout the summer, and to help them to see the connections between what they are learning in school and the world around them. There are so many opportunities to do this over the summer, whether that's planning a budget with your child, enjoying the natural beauty in York Region, reading a book or visiting local sites. Whatever your plans are this summer, I wish you all a successful end to the school year, and a safe and enjoyable summer. Hello all from the Guidance Department!

Our team has been busy with providing our students with their course request for next year. Please make sure your child has <u>submitted a signed course selection form</u> to the Guidance Department. A Course Selection Verification Sheet was distributed, students had their opportunity to request a change on this sheet or keep it for their personal records. The deadline has now passed.

The Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) deadline has now passed. Currently over 162 Thornlea students have applied. We wish them all the best and will continue to answer their questions on the University selection process. The marks transmission for OUAC was sent on <u>April 27<sup>th</sup></u>. Guidance will continue to monitor and support the College application process. Currently, over 40 Thornlea students have applied. No PinCodes are distributed for College Applications; students will create their own on-line at <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>.

Please note that the "equal consideration" deadline has passed (Feb. 1\*), but students can still apply. <u>The marks</u> transmission for OCAS was sent on <u>April 24</u><sup>th</sup>.

<u>University Applicants</u> - We highly recommend you accept your offer <u>before</u> the deadline of <u>June</u> <u>1</u>". You should be contacted by <u>May 26</u><sup>th</sup> if you have been accepted into your program. The next OUAC transmission will be on <u>July 5</u><sup>th</sup>. The next OCAS transmission will be on <u>July 7</u><sup>th</sup>.

Graduating students who plan to attend college or university in September should **continue to check their OCAS and OUAC accounts and their email** on a regular basis. College bound students should have received a response from the colleges that they applied to and can expect to receive communication about payment of fees, with June 15<sup>th</sup> being the earliest that Ontario Colleges can require payment of tuition fees. University bound students should expect a response from the universities that they have applied to by May 26<sup>th</sup>.

University bound students should verify the deadline for <u>payment</u> to secure a space in residence (usually June 1<sup>st</sup>).

A reminder that all offers are <u>CONDITIONAL</u> upon the receipt of final grades in July – students should continue to work hard to ensure the required final average.

Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OUAC for university! Your mid-term grades from semester 2 have been processed by OUAC and sent to the Universities to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OUAC does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OUAC/your Universities because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OUAC file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counselor as soon as possible to have it corrected.

#### Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OCAS for college! Your mid-term grades from semester 2 have been processed by OCAS and sent to the Colleges to

which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OCAS does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OCAS/your Colleges because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OCAS file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counselor as soon as possible to have it corrected

College and University Open Houses are a popular way for prospective students to visit various Post-Secondary Institutions and evaluate them prior to applying and/or choosing. It is never too early to begin the search. The Guidance Department encourages all students, especially in grades 11 and 12 to attend the open house program of any potential future University/College. Please visit the University/College website to confirm Open House schedules. Spaces can be limited. We also would like to remind students of the process for making guidance appointments. If any student would like to make an appointment with their Alpha identified counselor (Mr. Paul Stephenson A to M, Mr. Nizam Alkins N to Z, they should come to the Guidance Office before school starts (8:30 to 8:55), during their lunch, or after school (3:00 to 3:30).

We would also like to remind students that there is a new process in place for Community Service Hours (CSH). All students must complete 40 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. Please see your counselor for a CSH sheet and pre-approval. <u>Finally, a reminder to all</u> grade 12 students; that they should hand in their community service hours as soon as possible. <u>It is highly recommended that this be completed before Exams start – June 20th.</u>

For more information on volunteer opportunities, please come down to the Guidance Office and pick up a Community Service Hours form and please take a look at our "Volunteer Bulletin Board" for current opportunities to fulfill this Ministry of Education requirement.

RE: Examination Schedule & Information – JUNE 2017

The examination period for semester two is fast approaching. The exam schedule is on the back of this page. All exams are written at 10:00 a.m. beginning on Tuesday, June 20 until Tuesday, June 27. Please review the examination rules below, and determine the days on which your examinations are scheduled by highlighting your exams on the back of this page and taking note of the room location.

#### York Region District School Board Examination Rules

#### Examination Schedule:

All students must write their examinations at the scheduled time. Vacation, employment and/or appointments must not be scheduled during the examination period. Students must be available throughout the exam schedule should any exams need to be rescheduled due to unforeseen events.

It is the responsibility of each student to confirm the scheduled examination time, date, and location.

If a student has a valid medical certificate detailing why he/she was unable to write the final examination on the assigned day, the school's administration will deal with the situation on a case by case basis.

Should any exam day be cancelled, all evaluations scheduled for that day will be re-scheduled during the exam period. In such an event, check the website to learn when postponed exams will be written.

#### On the day of the examination:

- 1. Bring any remaining course textbooks to your examination to return to your teacher.
- 2. Arrive at the assigned examination room by 9:50 a.m.
- 3. Leave all books, pencil cases, geometry set cases, carrying cases or covers for calculators, I-pods, MP3 Players, cell phones, jackets or bags in your locker or at home as these are not allowed in the evaluation room. The exception is textbooks to be returned to the teacher which should be placed on the floor beside your desk and specific devices that a teacher has instructed you to bring beyond the pen, pencil and eraser normally required.

#### During the examination:

- You must not talk or communicate in any way with any student in the evaluation room once the evaluation has begun.
- You must remain in the evaluation room for <u>one full hour</u> and you may not leave during the last fifteen minutes of the evaluation time.
- 3. No items may be borrowed/shared during an exam.
- 4. Any student cheating on an evaluation or trying to pass information to another student will have their test paper immediately confiscated by the teacher and will be referred to administration who will determine the grade received on a case by case basis.

#### After the examination:

- Vacate the building as soon as your examination is completed. There is no cafeteria service during this time and teachers are occupied marking.
- Exam Consultation Day is on June 28, from 1-3:00 pm. Please see below for the schedule.
