Message from the Administration

Dear Families and Community Members,

We have entered Rotation #4 and are nearing the midway point of Semester 2. A reminder that Feedback Days are scheduled at the end of each rotation and prior to a new rotation. During the Feedback Days, students attend all classes online for the morning block; 35 min classes, both cohorts. The afternoon portion is asynchronous. Teachers may connect individually with students and families for targeted student needs, supports and/or feedback.

Our team has been extremely busy with providing our students with their course request verification sheets for next year. Please make sure your child has submitted a signed course selection verification form if they would like to request a change.

Reminder: It will be very difficult after March 29th to make any new changes for next year's timetable.

The Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) deadline has now passed. We wish them all the best and will continue to answer their questions on the University selection process. The next marks transmission for OUAC will be on **April 25**th. More conditional offers will usually be given by May 10th. The last day Ontario Universities might give out conditional offers is: May 29th

Guidance will continue to monitor and support the College application process. No PinCodes are distributed for College Applications; students will create their own on-line at www.ontariocolleges.ca. Please note that the "equal consideration" deadline has passed (Feb. 1st), but students can still apply. The next marks transmission for OCAS will be on **April 25**th.

Guidance already offered a College application seminar. If you need further assistance please see Ms. Lovleen Rai in the Guidance Office.

Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied to OUAC for university and OCAS for College. Your grades from semester one have been processed by OUAC and OCAS and sent to the Universities and Colleges to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OUAC does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OUAC/your Universities because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OUAC file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counsellor as soon as possible to have it corrected.

College and University Spring Open Houses are a popular way for prospective students to visit various Post-Secondary Institutions and evaluate them prior to applying and/or choosing. It is never too early to begin the search. The Guidance Department encourages all students, especially in grades 11 and 12 to attend the open house program of any potential future University/College. Please visit the University/College website to confirm Open House schedules during March Break. Spaces can be limited.

Community Service Hours

We would also like to remind our learning community that there is a process in place for Community Service Hours. All students must complete 40 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. Please see your counselor for pre-approval. It should be at a Not-For-Profit organization.

A reminder to all grade 12 students; that they should hand in their community service hours ASAP. There are still approximately 45 of you that must submit their hours before the next OUAC/OCAS transmission.

Attention Grade 12 students, you may request <u>Part-Time Status</u> starting on <u>Monday April 8th</u>. Please come to the guidance office to pick up a drop request form. This form must be completed and handed in by <u>Friday April 26th 3:00 PM</u>. The <u>Full Disclosure</u> date is Thursday May 2nd, after that date, the mark will be recorded permanently on their official transcript.

Summer School Registration Information

Registration is open on Monday April 1^{st} – register on-line in your myPathway Planner (myBlueprint) account, get your sheet signed by a parent/guardian and hand it in to your guidance counselor asap.




Celebrating our Student's Success:
