Hello all from the Guidance Department!

Our team has been busy with providing our students with their course request for next year. Please make sure your child has <u>submitted a signed course selection form</u> to the Guidance Department. A Course Selection Verification Sheet was distributed, students had their opportunity to request a change on this sheet or keep it for their personal records. The deadline has now passed.

The Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) deadline has now passed. Currently over 162 Thornlea students have applied. We wish them all the best and will continue to answer their questions on the University selection process. The marks transmission for OUAC was sent on <u>April 27th</u>.

Guidance will continue to monitor and support the College application process. Currently, over 40 Thonrlea students have applied. No PinCodes are distributed for College Applications; students will create their own on-line at <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>.

Please note that the "equal consideration" deadline has passed (Feb. 1^{st}), but students can still apply. The marks transmission for OCAS was sent on <u>April 24th</u>.

<u>University Applicants</u> - We highly recommend you accept your offer <u>before</u> the deadline of <u>June</u> <u>1st</u>. You should be contacted by <u>May 26th</u> if you have been accepted into your program. The next OUAC transmission will be on <u>July 5th</u>. The next OCAS transmission will be on July 7th.

Graduating students who plan to attend college or university in September should **continue to check their OCAS and OUAC accounts and their email** on a regular basis. College bound students should have received a response from the colleges that they applied to and can expect to receive communication about payment of fees, with June 15th being the earliest that Ontario Colleges can require payment of tuition fees. University bound students should expect a response from the universities that they have applied to by May 26th.

University bound students should verify the deadline for **<u>payment</u>** to secure a space in residence (usually June 1st).

A reminder that **all offers are <u>CONDITIONAL</u> upon the receipt of final grades** in July – students should continue to work hard to ensure the required final average.

Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OUAC for university! Your mid-term grades from semester 2 have been processed by OUAC and sent to the Universities to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OUAC does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OUAC/your Universities because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OUAC file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counsellor as soon as possible to have it corrected.

Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OCAS for college! Your mid-term grades from semester 2 have been processed by OCAS and sent to the Colleges to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OCAS does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OCAS/your Colleges because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OCAS file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counselor as soon as possible to have it corrected College and University Spring Open Houses are a popular way for prospective students to visit various Post-Secondary Institutions and evaluate them prior to applying and/or choosing. It is never too early to begin the search. The Guidance Department encourages all students, especially in grades 11 and 12 to attend the open house program of any potential future University/College. Please visit the University/College website to confirm Open House schedules. Spaces can be limited.

We also would like to remind students of the process for making guidance appointments. If any student would like to make an appointment with their Alpha identified counselor(Mr. Paul Stephenson A to M, Mr. Nizam Alkins N to Z, they should come to the Guidance Office before school starts (8:30 to 8:55), during their lunch, or after school (3:00 to 3:30).

We would also like to remind students that there is a new process in place for Community Service Hours (CSH). All students must complete 40 community hours to obtain their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The Guidance department must approve your community service opportunity before you start your hours. Please see your counselor for a CSH sheet and pre-approval. <u>Finally, a reminder to all grade 12 students; that they should</u> <u>hand in their community service hours as soon as possible. It is highly recommended that this be completed</u> <u>before the April 27/24 OUAC/OCAS transmission.</u>

For more information on volunteer opportunities, please come down to the Guidance Office and pick up a Community Service Hours form and please take a look at our "**Volunteer Bulletin Board**" for current opportunities to fulfill this Ministry of Education requirement.

Attention Grade 12 students, you may request <u>Part-Time Status</u> started on <u>Monday April 10th</u>. Please come to the guidance office to pick up a drop request form. This form must be completed and handed in by <u>Fri-day April 27th 3:00 PM</u>. The <u>Full Disclosure</u> date is Thursday May 4th, after that date, the mark will be re-corded on their official transcript.

Commencement for the Class of 2017

Thornlea's *Class of 2017* is getting ready to graduate. Please attend our 49th graduation ceremony on **June 29th**, 2017 to celebrate your graduate's achievement!

Each year the graduating class of Thornlea Secondary School selects a graduating student to give the **Valedictorian** address at the Graduation ceremony. The students' choice of Valedictorian should be someone who can be counted upon to skillfully articulate to parents and students a "snapshot" of your years at Thornlea. The Valedictorian should be someone who exemplifies the character traits of responsibility, respect, honesty, empathy, fairness, initiative, courage, integrity, perseverance and optimism; who has demonstrated commitment to student life through active involvement in a variety of school activities and has contributed in a positive way to Thornlea. Art Murch was the first principal of Thornlea. When he retired in 1976, the staff set up a trust in his name. From the trust, The **Art Murch Award**, a monetary award is given annually to the graduating student who has a high academic standing, is very active in school life, and is highly regarded by his/her peers and teachers. The recipient should best exemplify the motto "Think and Be Thought Of". The winner is revealed at commencement.

Valedictorian Candidates and Art Murch Candidates are nominated by their peers on a form available in the Guidance office now. Voting will take place on <u>Tuesday, May 16, 2017</u> during homeroom.
