Feedback Days

Feedback Days will occur weekly, each Friday, until the end of the school year. During the Feedback Days, students will attend all classes online as per the regular school schedule (75 min/class). It will be an opportunity for teachers to connect individually with students and families for targeted student needs, supports and/or feedback but also for the class to engage in some fun activities.

School Council

Our final Parent Council meeting was held on Thursday May 17th. We provided updates to families about our virtual graduation and the projected timetable and schedule for the upcoming school year. Confirmation of our board's school model for 2021-2022 is still pending and we will share this information as soon as it becomes available.

Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

We hope this correspondence finds you, your family and loved ones healthy and safe.

As you may be aware, the Advanced Placement College Board has announced that all AP exams, excluding World Language Exams, may be completed digitally. Unfortunately, the AP College Board has determined that the World Language Exams can only be administered in a proctored school setting.

Currently, Ontario remains in the Lockdown Zone and subject to the rules set out under the *Reopening Ontario (A Flexible Response to COVID-19) Act, 2020*. Given that elementary and secondary schools in Ontario are not permitted to offer in-person learning at this time (with the exception of students with special education needs), including exams, no exceptions can be granted for AP Exams.

If the stay-at-home order is not lifted on June 2nd and students are not able to return to in-person learning, then we regret to inform you that all Language AP exams will be cancelled and money refunded. We continue to work with and follow the advice of York Public Health to ensure we provide safe and healthy environments for students and staff.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact the AP Teacher/Coordinator or school administrator to discuss your questions.

We remain deeply committed to supporting our students and families as we continue to navigate the effects of COVID-19 on education. If our school can support your family in any way, we encourage you to connect with us.

Guidance Appointments

Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OUAC for university!

Your mid-term grades from semester two have been processed by OUAC and sent to the Universities to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to re-view your academic information. This verification is especially important if OUAC does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OUAC/your Universities because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OUAC file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counselor as soon as possible to have it corrected.

Important Notice for all grade 12's that have applied through OCAS for college!

Your mid-term grades from semester two have been processed by OCAS and sent to the Colleges to which you have applied. Please log on to your online application in order to review your academic information. This verification is especially important if OCAS does not have a valid email address on file, or you are not able to receive emails from OCAS/your Colleges because of a junk-mail setting with you inbox. If you see an error in your OCAS file, it is very important that you contact your Guidance Counselor as soon as possible to have it corrected.

From OUAC:

Today (**May 27**) by the end of the day (11:59PM) would be when students can expect a response from universities if they had applied by January 15th. If any students haven't heard back and have concerns, we recommend having them reach out to the universities' admissions offices directly for more information.

Generally speaking, the deadline to accept an offer is June 1st at 11:59PM. However, each offer listed in their applications will have a listed expiry date which will be June 1st or later. Their deadline to accept the offer would be 11:59PM on the day listed there.

OUAC – Ontario University Important Dates:

Ontario **University Applicants** - We highly recommend you accept your offer **before** the deadline of **June 1st**. You should be contacted by **May 27th** if you have been accepted into your program.

May 27, 2021

The latest date all high school applicants who submitted their application by the January application deadline can expect a response from an Ontario university. This includes: an offer of admission; a refusal; or a deferral, once additional information is received.

June 1, 2021(deadline to accept)

The earliest date an Ontario high school student may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.).

All other admissions-related elements, including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives, and offers of residence are considered part of the offer of admission. Therefore, a student may accept these other offers before June 1, 2021, but Ontario universities will not compel a student in any way to make a decision earlier than this date.

Starting June 4, 2021

The date the Admission Information Service (AIS) opens. The AIS allows you to determine which Ontario universities still have spots available in first-year undergraduate programs.

OCAS – Ontario College Important Dates:

May 1st is the most common deadline for confirming offers of admission – but not the only one. Applicants should check their offers of admission, daily, for **exact** deadline dates. If you have any questions, please see a guidance counselor immediately.

June 2021: Tuition Deposit Due at the Colleges

The colleges require payment of a tuition deposit in June to secure your spot in your program. Each college sets its own tuition deposit amount and payment deadline. This information will be communicated to you by the college.

Graduating students who plan to attend college or university in September 2021 should **continue to check their OCAS and OUAC accounts and their email** on a regular basis.

A reminder that **all offers are CONDITIONAL upon the receipt of final grades** – students should continue to work hard to ensure the required final average.

Please see your counselor for pre-approval. It should be at a Not-For-Profit organization.

A reminder to all grade 12 students; that they should hand in their community service hours ASAP. Due to the pandemic – graduating students only require 20 hours this school year.

To begin your search, visit www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101 and click:

Once you find an open program of interest, add it to your 101 application.

Requirements:

- You will be completing or have completed the OSSD (or equivalent), including six 4U/M courses, by early September 2021.
- You must have an average of at least 60%, although higher averages are usually required.

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
