Interested parents need to complete the <u>STEM Certificate Expression of Interest Google Form</u>.


Families will be notified as of September 2025 that their STEM Certificate registration has been confirmed.

Grade 10 Business Field Trip

On May 22, we had 70 Grade 10 Thornlea Students attend the Business Field Trip! The rain didn't stop us! Students had an enjoyable and educational experience touring and exploring the financial district downtown Toronto outdoors and underground through the PATH. They discovered how banking and finance made Toronto a world banking centre and learned about some of the city's hidden historical treasures at Toronto's financial district. They saw first hand the big 5 banks, the top 4 accounting firms, the TSX, learned about the role and function of the Bank of Canada, explored the unique architecture of the BCE/Brookfield place, and walked through the PATH, Toronto's underground city. Students also had the opportunity to explore historical and important buildings such as the Oldest Banking Building, the old safety deposit vault, the Old and New City Halls, as well as independent businesses in and around the Eaton Centre, the epitome of interior "atrium" spaces for which Canadian architecture became known internationally in the 1970s.









Business SHSM ICE Workshop on May 20

On May 20, in collaboration with Y2 Entrepreneurship Labs, Creative Genius Academy and Alexander Mackenzie High School, some of Thornlea's Business SHSM students attended the Business SHSM ICE (Innovation, Creativity and Entrepreneurship) Program. The SHSM ICE training and Problem-Based Learning 1-day training workshop met the needs of our Business SHSM students and fulfilled their SPE-ICE credentials.
