Dear Parents/Guardians,

It is important to us that we provide a caring, safe and inclusive environment in our school that supports the academic achievement and well-being of all students. To support this environment, you may have heard that the Ontario Ministry of Education has revised the provincial Code of Conduct (Policy/Program Memorandum No. 128) to include a restriction on the use of personal mobile devices during instructional time **as of November 4, 2019.**

The revision states that the use of personal mobile devices (i.e. cell phones) during instructional time is not permitted unless under the following circumstances:

- for educational purposes, as directed by an educator;
- for health and medical purposes;
- to support special education needs and/or English-Language Learners.

This is consistent with our guidelines about mobile devices. It has always been our policy that cell phones and other personal communication devices must be turned off and kept out of sight during all instructional periods, except with the clear permission of the principal or the classroom teacher. Additionally, camera and/or video functions on mobile devices are not permitted for use on school property without clear permission from the principal or teacher. At no time may mobile devices be used in washrooms or change rooms.

We recognize that learning can be enhanced by technology and we have created opportunities in our classrooms to leverage digital tools to enhance teaching, learning and communication.

Infractions will be dealt with as progressive discipline, under Caring and Safe Schools Policy and its related procedures. As always, students are responsible for the care and security of their personal devices. The school is not responsible for any damage, loss or theft.

Thank you for helping us create a safe, respectful and inclusive school community. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to see the school's administration in the main office.

Thornlea Secondary School Anticipated Absence Form

Students are expected to be in full attendance every regular school day except in the case of illness or other unavoidable cause. There is a very close relationship between regular attendance and success in school. Absence from school may result in a lower mark or loss of credit.

Any student who requires an extraordinary absence must consult with his/her course teachers IN ADVANCE to determine the effect of the absence on his/her success and to obtain assignments that will be missed and must be completed during or immediately following the absence.

York Region District School Board policy states that examinations may only be written on the scheduled dates and times. A mark of zero will be given if an examination is not written on the scheduled date.

This form enables students and parents to plan for extraordinary absences.

1. The student must complete Part A.
2. All of the student's teachers must complete a section of Part B.
3. The student and his/her parent/guardian should then make decisions about the feasibility of the absence, knowing the possible effects on the student's success in his/her courses.
4. The parent/guardian must complete Part C.
5. Finally, the form is brought to the office for an administrator to sign, indicating it has been received. A copy of the completed form is made with one for school records and one for the student.



Note: Ontario High Schools **do not** transmit Mid-Term Marks. The next transmission to the Ontario Universities Application Centre will be on Feb. 13th, 2020 (Final Marks for 1st semester).

University Applications:

You can select as many University programs as you would like (\$50.00 each), but, you can only choose a **maximum of 3 programs** per University. For example:

Only 3 choices can be used for all University of Toronto campuses, for example (St. George, Scarborough, Mississauga) can have one program each or all 3 at Scarborough or any combination adding up to 3.

Waterloo University, you could only select a maximum of 3 programs. If you wanted to add a 4th you cannot.

If you need clarification on this process or have questions, please do not hesitate to ask your child’s counselor.

You can apply to an Ontario College today! Deadline for equal consideration is Feb. 1st 2020.

Grade 9 students that complete their 40 community service hours in their grade 9 year will receive a special certificate of completion. This is for grade 9's only. The 40 hours must be submitted into our Guidance Office by **Friday June 19th to Qualify**.

STUDENT VOTE RESULTS AT THORNLEA SECONDARY SCHOOL October 18, 2019



In recognition of this year's Federal Election, which occurred on Monday October 21, students at Thornlea Secondary School participated in a school wide Student Vote Election.

Student Vote provides youth, under the voting age, with an opportunity to experience the voting process firsthand and build the habits of active and engaged citizenship. Students learn about government and the electoral process, and research the issues, parties and candidates through classroom learning, campaign activities, media consumption and family dialogue.

Thornlea's Student Vote occurred on **Friday October 18, 2019**. As a tribute to the election process, the results of the Student Vote are now being shared following the close of the polls. It was a successful turnout of our student body on Student Vote Day!





THE RESULTS ARE IN!



On October 21st, 2019, the elected Federal government was announced. The Liberal government won the election with a minority government. Out of the 338 seats in the House of Commons the government received 157 seats. The Conservatives came in as the official opposition with 121 seats.

7, 855 Ontario Schools participated in this year's Student Vote, representing all 338 electoral districts in Canada. The results are in!

CANADA WIDE RESULTS:

Nationwide, over a million votes were cast in the Student Vote with all 338 ridings reported. The results of student vote in Canada mirrored that of the actual election, with a Liberal minority government (110 seats), the New Democratic Party (NDP) as the official opposition (99 seats), followed by the Conservatives (94 seats).

THORNLEA:

Here at Thornlea Secondary School, the vote was based on the **Markham – Thornhill Electoral District**. The results were:

Liberal Party Candidate – Mary Ng – 216 votes

Conservative – Alex Yuan – 123 votes

NDP – Paul Sahbaz – 122 votes

Green Party – Chris Williams – 78 votes

People's Party – Peter Remedios – 34 votes

Independent – Josepbai Macwan – 15 votes



The actual votes tallied from Election Night indicated that the winner of the Markham – Thornhill Electoral District was **Mary Ng (Liberal Party)**.

A huge thank you to our Student Volunteers and Teacher Facilitators who assisted with the voting process on Student Vote Day, and to our staff and students who participated in this mock election.

To our students who will be of voting age next election, you are the voice of the future – ensure you go out and use your right to vote. We encourage all our students here at Thornlea to continue to speak their minds and strive for change in the future. Until next time Thornlea, remember student voice matters! *Go Thunder!*
