Dear Parents/Guardians of Grade 10 students:

The **Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test** (OSSLT) is a requirement for students who wish to graduate with a secondary school diploma. At Thornlea Secondary School, we are taking many steps to assist our students in completing the test successfully. One way that we have chosen to assist our students is by offering an after school program to reinforce reading and writing skills.

While receiving additional assistance through the after school program, your son/daughter will continue to receive regular instruction from his/her classroom teachers related to the reading and writing skills required for each subject. We believe that this special program will make a difference in your sons/daughter's knowledge and confidence related to reading and writing. For some students, further assistance will be required. For this group of students, a second set of sessions may be offered later in the school year.

Please read and complete the attached Student Registration Form if you think that your son/daughter would benefit from the after school literacy program. Your signature is required as permission for your son/daughter to participate in the after school program. Or alternatively, forms will be available in the guidance office, periods 3 and 4. Please note that the school is not able to provide transportation for students within the time frame of this program, so there may be a need for you to arrange transportation for your son/daughter following each session. In addition, a commitment from 12 students is necessary for this program to be offered.



All fees are non-refundable. Your application will not be forwarded to your university choice(s) until you submit full payment to the OUAC. Fees for withdrawn university choices are not refunded.

Summary of Fees

All fees are listed in Canadian dollars. These fees are for fall entry 2016.

Base Application Fee: \$150

For the initial 3 university/program choices.

International Service Fee: \$10

If the mailing address is outside of Canada.

Additional Choice Fee: \$50/choice

For each university/program choice beyond the initial 3 (e.g., if 2 additional university choices are added, you must pay \$100 in addition to the base application fee).

Note: You may apply to as many Ontario universities/programs as you wish; however, you are limited to a maximum of 3 program choices at any one university (including its affiliates). Some universities may further limit the number of programs you can apply to.

Methods of Payment

Payment for online applications is accepted by:

- Credit card (VISA, MasterCard or American Express). Prepaid credit cards and VISA debit cards are not accepted.
- Online banking (Canadian banks and credit unions only). Normally takes 1-3 business days.

These are important dates in your application process. Please check them carefully and keep them in mind as you apply.

2015

Late August 2015

The eINFO site goes live. Visit the eINFO website to start your research.

September 25-27, 2015

All 21 Ontario universities are in one place at the <u>Ontario Universities' Fair (OUF)</u>. Just for you! Faculty, academics and knowledgeable representatives are ready to answer your questions.

October - November 2015

Gather information about Ontario's 21 universities at the <u>University Information Program (UIP)</u>. The UIP travels across Ontario after the OUF, offering fair- or presentation-style events in most Ontario regions.

By the end of November 2015

You will receive your Application Access Code Letter from your guidance counsellor with your school number, student number and temporary PIN. Keep this letter for your records. You will need this information to apply.

2016

January 13, 2016

Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.

Note: The OUAC still processes applications received after this date and distributes them to the universities. However, specific university deadlines will apply.

The initial application includes all final grades from completed Grade 11 and 12 courses and a list of all currentyear courses in progress.

January 21, 2016

Target date for Ontario universities to receive all application data and grades from the OUAC for all applications submitted by January 13, 2016.

February 5, 2016

Recommended last date for you to submit all information to the OUAC to be considered for early admission. This information includes university and program changes and additional active choices.

Note: This is not a deadline. The OUAC accepts and processes changes at any time.

March 2, 2016

Target date for Ontario universities to receive all final first-semester and current full-year grades for 4U/M courses from the OUAC.

May 5, 2016

Target date for Ontario universities to receive second-semester midterm and interim grades for full-year courses from the OUAC. Grades that the OUAC receives earlier will be sent to Ontario universities when received.

101 Important Dates. | Centrio Universities' Application Centre

May 27, 2016

The latest date by which you can expect a response from an Ontario university. This includes:

- an offer of admission;
- a refusal; or
- a deferral, pending the receipt of specific information.

June 1, 2016

The earliest date you may be required to respond to an Ontario university offer of admission and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.).

All other admissions related elements, including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives, and offers of residence are considered part of the offer of admission. Therefore, you may accept these other offers prior to June 1, 2015, but Ontario universities will not compel a student in any way to make a decision earlier.

July 14, 2016

Target date for the OLIAC to transmit all remaining final grades to the universities.

Early June to August 2016

The <u>Admission Information Service (AIS)</u> allows you to determine which Ontario universities still have spots available in first-year undergraduate programs.



Early October, 2015

The online application is available at ontariocolleges.ca.

November 23, 2015

First date that 2016 / 2017 application data is sent to the colleges. This is also the earliest date that colleges may notify applicants that their application has been received.

February 1, 2016

The deadline for applying to highly competitive programs.

Applications received and paid for before this date will be given equal consideration by the colleges.

NOTE: Applicants for all programs are encouraged to apply before this date, as website volumes are highest at this time.

OFFER

February 1, 2016

Earliest date the colleges may release offers to applicants. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or waitlists are established.

NOTE: Applicants who have not met admission requirements for a program may be notified at any time during the application process.

ACCEPT

February 1, 2016

Earliest date that applicants may confirm an offer of admission.

May 1, 2016

The most common deadline for confirming offers of admission but not the only one. Applicants should check their offers of admission for exact deadline dates.

June 15, 2016

Earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees.

DATA TRANSMISSION SCHEDULE

Data files from school boards and / or high schools are due at OCAS on the following dates:

October 5 - 9, 2015

Demographics, marks history, and current and projected registrations are due. OCAS requires marks history for all courses taken in grades 9, 10 and 11.

November 20 - 25, 2015

First semester midterm marks are due. Schools may transmit interim marks for full-year courses as soon as they are available.

February 12, 2016

For semestered schools: First semester final marks and currently enrolled second semester courses are due.

For non-semestered schools: Interim marks are due.

April 25 - 29, 2016

July 8, 2016

For non-semestered schools: Final marks and proof of graduation are due.

August 19, 2016

Dear secondary school students, parents and guardians,

This letter is to provide you with an update regarding the escalation of job sanctions by the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE), which represents education support staff members.

On September 29, 2015, CUPE escalated its withdrawal of services, which includes:

- not handling money;
- not sweeping hallways or entrances unless there is a safety concern; and
- not cutting grass or cleaning up leaves unless there is a safety concern.

A list of additional activities being withdrawn by CUPE members is available on the Board's website. As a result of these sanctions, parents and students may notice that some programs or activities may be cancelled.

The York Region District School Board is undertaking all possible measures to minimize the impact of labour sanctions on students and their families. It is important to note that the job actions are a result of the bargaining process at the provincial level and Board employees are required to follow the direction of their provincial union. At the local Board level, we continue to bargain with all our employee groups, including CUPE.
