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Message from the Principal

Dear Thornlea Families;

The first week of school is now almost complete as I write this message. I want to make you aware of a few developments at Thornlea. All week our Guidance department has been working to resolve student conflicts and create timetables for our new registrations. If you have concerns about your child's schedule please let me know and we will do our best to remedy the problem. Currently there are about 1080 students enrolled at Thornlea and of that total a little less than 100 students are attending online.

This Tuesday our first school council meeting will take place online at 7:00 p.m. We first need to select our council and then I will update the council on what has taken place at Thornlea so far this year. At the end of my brief presentation I will answer any questions you have about the school and what will take place this year. An invite will be sent to all parent/guardians email address.

We are doing our best to bring back our sports program this semester. We hope to have a cross country team, boys' soccer and a coed tennis team running in the fall. I will explain the limitations that have been placed on our athletic program by Public Health. In addition to athletics our large number of clubs and our drama program will also be up and running shortly. We have traditionally had a club fair the third week of school. We will do this again except we are going to have our sign up occur outside at lunch. More details will be shared shortly.

With our students returning to school we are doing our best to keep everybody at Thornlea safe. If your child has symptoms of Covid please keep them home at home and follow the direction of your family doctor or Public Health. This year the capacity of our cafeteria has been reduced by half. We are encouraging students and staff to eat outside while the weather remains good. There are many picnic tables spread out along our property. Students are also able to eat their lunch in our hallways. We will be opening classrooms as a spot for students to have lunch as the temperature outside drops. I hope that many of you can attend our first council meeting this Tuesday.

AFTER SCHOOL WALK-IN COVID-19 VACCINATION CLINICS AVAILABLE NEAR YOU

Thursday, September 9, 2021

York Region Public Health will be offering after school walk-in COVID-19 vaccination clinics for students, staff and their families requiring a first and/or second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. Weekend clinics will also be open to the public.

We cannot stress enough how important it is to get vaccinated. The Delta variant of COVID-19 is much more transmissible than the original COVID-19 virus. COVID-19 vaccines not only protect you from getting seriously ill, they also help prevent people around you from getting sick, including younger children and siblings who aren't eligible to receive the vaccine.

Children and youth born in 2009 and earlier are currently eligible to be vaccinated. If you or your child have not received a first or second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, we want to make it as easy as possible. York Region Public Health will be offering walk-in vaccination clinics, with no appointment required, at the following dates, clinic times and host school locations:

Both the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna mRNA vaccines will be offered at these vaccination clinics. Those under 18 years of age will receive Pfizer-BioNTech.

Second doses:

- Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine must be administered at least 21 days after receipt of the first dose
- Moderna vaccine must be administered at least 28 days after receipt of the first dose

Children and youth born in 2009 and earlier can provide <u>consent</u> for themselves to receive a COVID-19 vaccine. Parental consent is not required in this age group. If students who need a substitute decision-maker or who are unable to provide their own informed consent attend the clinic on their own, they must bring a completed consent form that has been signed by a parent/legal guardian with them.

Message From Our Trustee, September 2021

We have many reasons to feel optimistic as we begin the 2021-22 school year. Schools are reopening to in-person learning, vaccination rates continue to increase, and our students can start to resume some of their favourite school activities.

As we return to school, our <u>reopening plan</u> continues to prioritize the health and safety of students, families and staff members. The pandemic and last year's school closures affected students and families in many different ways. This has been a challenging time. Our caring, skilled and dedicated staff members are prepared to prioritize the mental health and well-being of students as they transition back to school, as well as supporting their academic learning and growth. If you are worried about your child, please speak to your child's teacher or principal. You may also find some of the learning and well-being resources on our website helpful.

Whether your child will be attending school in person or online, we know how important it is that they feel safe, respected and valued. We want every student to feel supported, to take pride in their identities and to know that they matter. Any form of hate or discrimination in our schools is not acceptable. This school year, we will continue to implement the <u>Dismantling Anti-Black</u> <u>Racism Strategy</u> launched in March to address anti-Black racism in schools. We also remain committed as a school board to honouring the <u>Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to</u> <u>Action</u>. As your trustee, it is imperative that we create learning environments that enable all of our students to feel valued and to be successful, and I welcome the insights that were shared at the National Summit on Antisemitism and National Summit on Islamophobia.

It is my role to advocate for quality public education in York Region, and to ensure that our students remain at the centre of all of our decision making. The Board of Trustees makes <u>policy</u> and <u>budget</u> decisions, and communicates with the public, among other <u>responsibilities</u>. We are also responsible for setting direction for the school board, through our <u>Multi-Year Strategic Plan</u>. This plan sets out four priorities: Foster Well-Being and Mental Health, Build Collaborative Relationships, Champion Equity and Inclusivity, and Empower Ethical Leadership.
