As we bid farewell to the first month of the school year, I've been impressed by the number and variety of extra-curricular activities and programs that are available at school; many of which were on display at the Clubs Fair on September 19<sup>th</sup>. It was a busy and productive first month of the school year with a lot of events that took place in the school. In addition to finalizing countless student timetables, we welcomed all grade 9 students and their parents on September 5<sup>th</sup> for the Grade 9 Orientation Day. It provided all the grade 9's with the opportunity to explore the school, learn about how to be successful in high school, and the time to meet old peers and make new friends. They also experienced a wonderful day of icebreaker and team-building activities on the Grade 9 FIT Day at Green Acres Camp which took place on September 14<sup>th</sup>. ### Information about the Test:

- ⇒ Students are tested on basic reading and writing skills.
- ⇒ Successful completion of the OSSLT is a graduation requirement for all students who are working towards their diploma.
- ⇒ The OSSLT will take place on April 10, 2018.

### Preparing for the Test:

- ⇒ The staff will support your child in 'Whole School Initiatives' (WSI) sessions. Each session will focus on a specific aspect of the test in order provide your child with strategies and tips for completing the reading and writing tasks.
- ⇒ Dates for the WSI sessions in the first semester are:  
October 3 (Period 1); October 16 (Period 2); October 23 (Period 3);  
November 6 (Period 4); November 20 (Period 1)

### What You Can Do At Home:

- ⇒ I recommend looking at the EQAO website with your son/daughter. The website provides information and resources for the test.

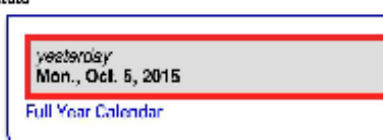

The online tool teachassist has the ability for parents/guardians to book appointments for Parents' Night. You will be able to book your appointments via Teachassist.

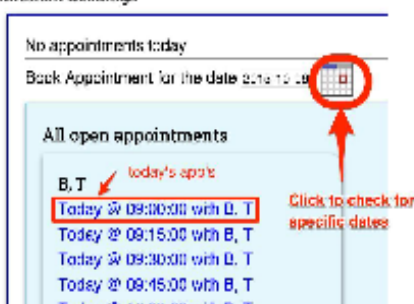
To book an Appointment with your classroom teacher who has set up appointment slots with TeachAssist:

1. Students or parents go to [ta.yrdsb.ca](http://ta.yrdsb.ca) . Use student's username (student number) and password to log in to Teachassist.
2. Once logged in scroll to the bottom of the page and if a teacher has created Appointment slots they will be visible on the page.

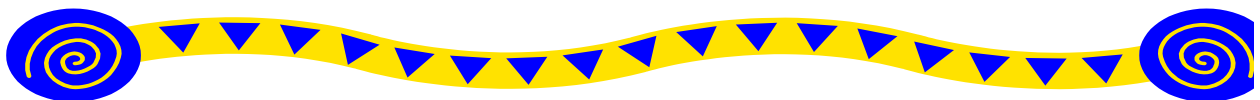

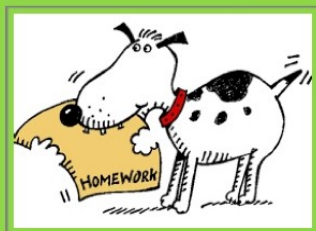

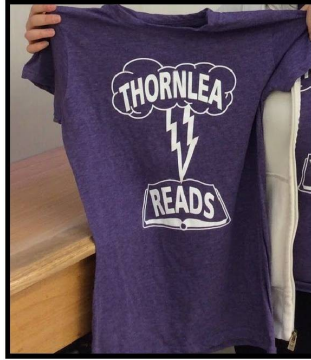

## Take Our Kids to Work

Take Our Kids to Work is the signature program of The Learning Partnership, a national charitable organization dedicated to supporting, promoting and advancing public education in Canada. Now in its 23<sup>rd</sup> year, Take Our Kids to Work annually involves more than 200,000 students in a day of career exploration and learning about the skills required in the world of work. On **Wednesday, November 1, 2017**, Grade 9, Senior 1 (Manitoba) and Secondary III (Quebec) students across Canada will spend the day at the workplace of a parent, relative, friend or volunteer host.

### For students, it's more than just a fun day. It's an opportunity to:

- Understand the importance of staying in school by seeing first-hand the skills required in today's workplace.
- Start exploring career options in a practical way and gaining a better understanding of how many career choices are open to them.
- Experience a day in the world of work and begin thinking about the kind of job they might aspire to.

*"Students have an opportunity to see what the workplace is like, appreciate the expectations, understand their parents better and understand the importance of planning a career path." – Educator*

### For parents, it's an opportunity to prepare children for the future by:

- Participating in a shared experience with their child.
- Enriching their child's experience with career discussions before, during, and after the workplace visit.

*"I brought my 14-year-old daughter to work and introduced her to the world of charitable giving and how people can make a difference. As a result of our day together, she told me two things: one, she is very proud of me and the work I do and two, that she is aiming for 300 volunteer hours over her next four years of high school." – Parent*

### What if it is not possible to go to work with a parent?

Parents invite their own children to join them at work for the day, but if this is not possible, there are other ways for your child to participate:

- Ask a relative, neighbour or family friend to take your child to work.
- Ask a parent who is taking his or her child to work if your son or daughter can join them for the day.
- Contact local businesses and ask if they are participating in Take Our Kids to Work day. Inquire if someone within their organization would be willing to host your child, providing you make the necessary transportation arrangements.

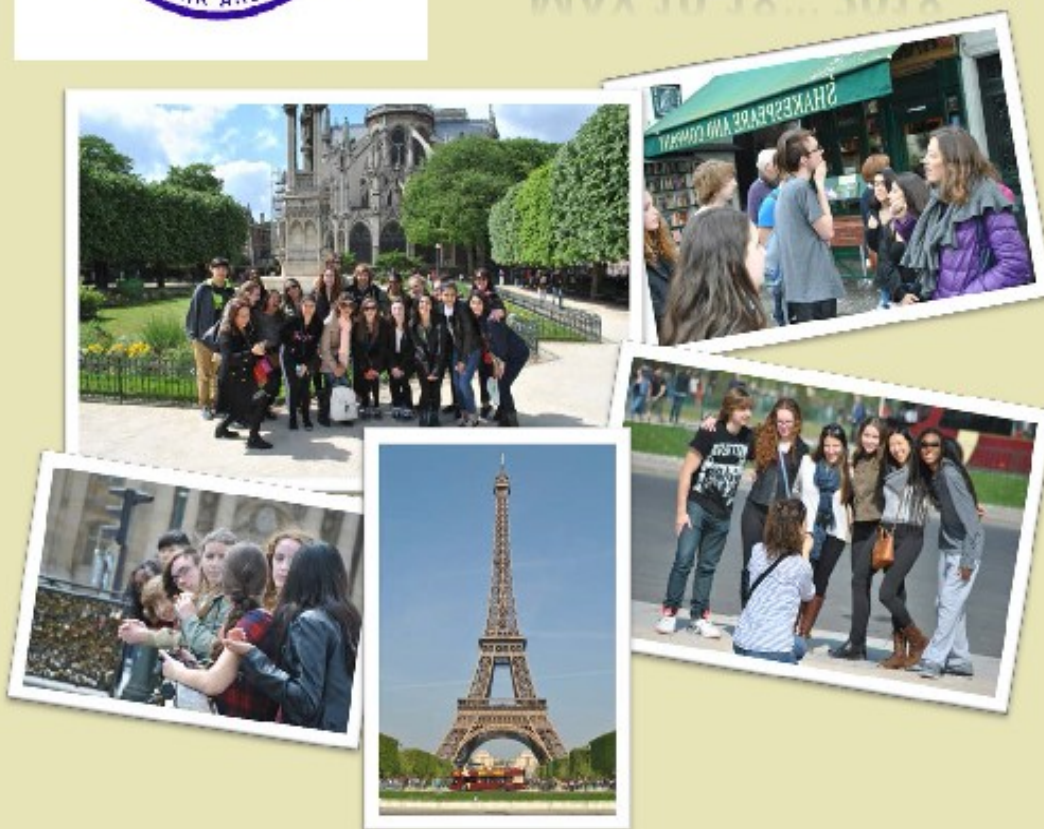

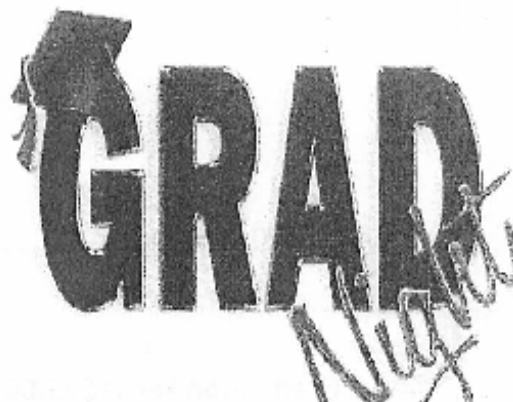

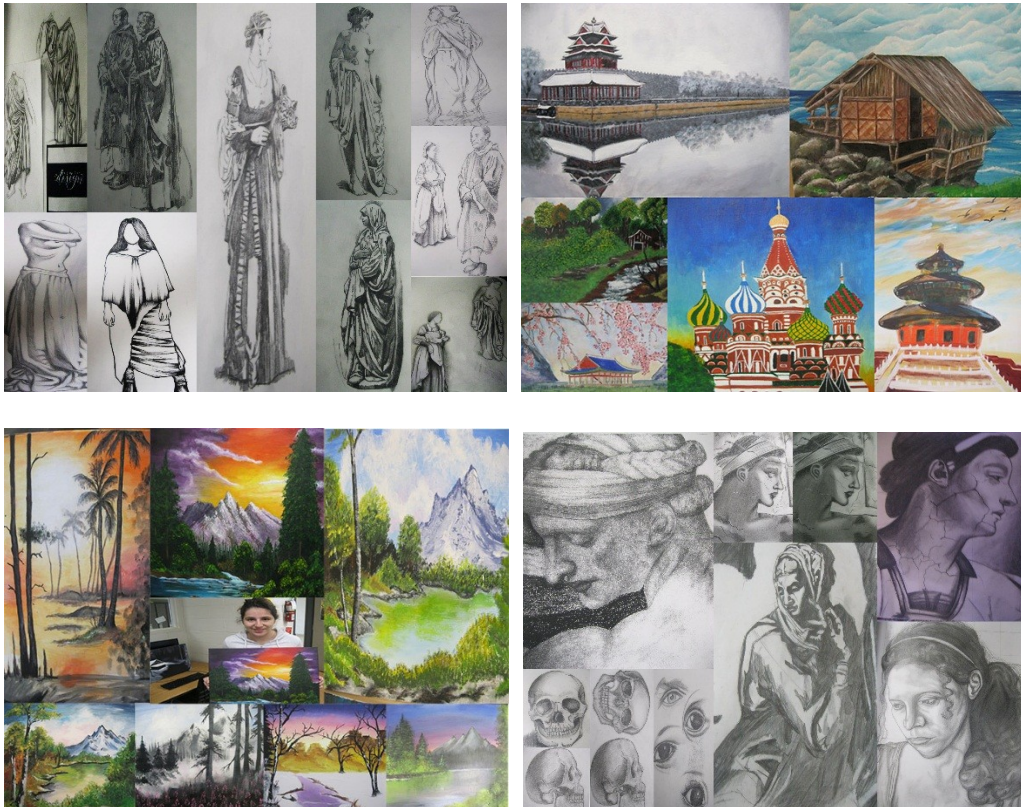
Dear Parents/ Guardians,
