### **Message From the Vice-Principal**

Dear Families and Community Members,

It's been a wonderful start to the school year. I personally want to extend greetings, well wishes, and a warm welcome to all grade nine students and new students to the Thornlea Secondary School community. As I write this message to you all, it's hard to believe that we are wrapping up the first month of the school year already.

On September 4<sup>th</sup>, it was our pleasure to welcome all grade 9 students and their parents to high school with the Grade 9 Orientation Day. The morning began with a welcome message from Principal Mr. Foti on behalf of the school's administration, Ms. Genevieve Seabrook who is Chair of our School Council, and Mr. Nigel Cole, our School Resource Officer. Grade 9 students then had the opportunity to learn about high school through interactive morning sessions while their parents had the opportunity to attend a Q & A session hosted by Mr. Foti. The students then experienced a day filled with a scavenger hunt around the school before meeting all their teachers for their semester one classes in the afternoon. Their welcome and transition to high school continued on September 13<sup>th</sup> at the Grade 9 FIT Day which took place at Green Acres Camp. Students benefited from icebreaker and team-building activities all day while also having the chance to meet other students and build new friendships.

We are also very thankful to all staff and students who are involved in the numerous extra-curricular clubs and activities that are available to everyone in the school. Clubs at Thornlea Secondary School had the opportunity to showcase themselves at the annual Clubs Fair which took place during lunch on September 18<sup>th</sup>. Although in the past this event took place in the hallways, this year's Club Fair took place in the cafeteria and was a huge success. Students had the opportunity to find out more information about the clubs and to register for activities available at Thornlea.

Athletics and physical activity have been well underway as well. On September 20<sup>th</sup> to raise awareness and to fundraise for cancer research, all staff and students participated in the annual Terry Fox Run which raised \$662.95. On September 26<sup>th</sup>, the Girls Basketball and Boys Volleyball teams won their season opener games. The Boys Soccer team lost their season opener game on September 26<sup>th</sup>, but are looking forward to a great season. The Boys 7's Rugby Team went undefeated in their first tournament and the Girl 7's Rugby team had one win at their first tournament. In addition, Cross Country had their first meet on September 26<sup>th</sup>.

Our school's Picture Day took place on September 7<sup>th</sup> and the school's Breakfast Club program which provides all students in the school with breakfast every morning launched for another school year as well. On September 17<sup>th</sup> we had our first School Council meeting of the school year. As I write this message, we are wrapping up Safety Week which included safety assemblies for each grade which outlined expectations of behaviour for all students in the school.

Looking ahead at the following weeks, look forward to the following important events:

For those who were absent for Picture Day, Photo Retake Day will be taking place on October 9<sup>th</sup>. Interim Report Cards will also be distributed to students on October 9<sup>th</sup> which is a progress report for all students in their classes up to this point in the semester. Dear Families,

Student voice is important to us. In November 2018, the York Region District School Board will invite all students to participate in the *Every Student Counts Survey* (*ESCS*). The purpose of this census survey is to better understand YRDSB's diverse student population as well as students' experiences in school and outside of school. The survey results will be used to help improve our schools and to:

- Identify and eliminate systemic barriers to student success;
- Create more equitable and inclusive school environments; and,
- Improve student achievement and well-being.

CCI Research has been contracted to work with the Board to conduct the survey and to ensure data privacy, security and adherence to all relevant legislation. To ensure that the surveys are age-appropriate, two surveys have been developed. The surveys are voluntary and confidential.

### Survey for students in Kindergarten to Grade 6

Families with a child in Kindergarten to Grade 6 will be invited to complete the survey online with their child at home. In November, a school letter will be sent home with a link to the online survey along with instructions. Families with more than one child in Kindergarten to Grade 6 will be asked to complete one survey per child. The online survey will be available in English, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Farsi, Gujarati, Hebrew, Korean, Punjabi, Russian, Tamil, Urdu, Vietnamese. If, for accessibility reasons, you require the survey on paper, in large print or braille please contact CCI Research at 1-866-450-4907 no later than October 9, 2018.

### Survey for students in Grades 7-12

In November, all students in Grades 7-12 will be invited to complete the survey online during class time. The online survey will be available in English, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Farsi, Russian, Tamil and Urdu. For accessibility purposes the survey will also be available in paper, large print and braille. Accommodations for students who need assistance completing the survey will be arranged by school staff in advance. Participation in the survey is voluntary. Students can skip questions that they do not want to answer. If you are a parent/guardian of child(ren) in Grades 7-12 and do not want them to participate in the survey, please contact CCI Research at 1-866-450-4907 no later than October 9, 2018.

As one of the main purposes of the survey is to identify and eliminate barriers to student achievement there will be a unique code on each survey for YRDSB to link the survey data with student achievement data. To ensure confidentiality, no directly identifying information (such as your child's name) will be on the survey. A summary of the results (grouped data only) will be available at schools and on the Board's website in Spring 2019.
