Dear Families and Community Members,

We have had a busy start to the school year with many more students enrolled at Thornlea. This in many ways is a good thing but it has created a lot of work for our guidance department. Today we have approximately 1085 students enrolled. Students in grade nine and twelve have had their timetables looked at by Guidance and Admin. Next week we will be helping grade ten and eleven students. These timetable changes should be completed by the end of next week, if you have any concerns please feel free to contact me.

Over the summer the school underwent a series of renovations new doors are still being installed at night and the weekends and a number of windows have also been replaced. Our gym has received a much needed upgrade. As I write this the gym floor will be getting its last coat of varnish and then will need a week to set up. We hope that we can use our gym again for Phys Ed classes and practices starting on Monday September 16th.

With the start of the school year sports and clubs are starting to meet. Our annual club fair takes place on September 17th at lunch. During that time students can learn about the 40 clubs we have at school and sign up for any clubs that interest them. Rugby, volleyball, basketball, soccer and cross country are starting up this week and next. LITERACY CORNER

Hello Parents and Guardians,

My name is Lovleen Rai and I am the Literacy Lead for the 2019 – 2020 school year. I look forward to working with your child to support his/her preparation for the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT).

Information about the Test:

- ⇒ Students are tested on basic reading and writing skills.
- ⇒ Successful completion of the OSSLT is a graduation requirement for all students who are working towards their diploma.
- ⇒ The OSSLT will take place on March 31, 2020.

'Whole School Initiatives' (WSIs):

- ⇒ All Grade 10 students (including Grade 11 & 12 students without the requirement) will write a WSI. Each WSI will focus on providing students with an opportunity to practice the reading & writing tasks from past OSSLTs.
- ⇒ Dates for the WSI sessions during semester 1 are: Period 1 on October 4 = Multiple-Choice Questions Period 2 on October 28 = Writing Short Writing Tasks & Finding a Main Idea Period 3 on November 26 = Writing Open Responses Period 4 on December 12 = Writing a Series of Paragraphs

OSSLT Lessons for Grade 10 Students Only:

- ⇒ Grade 10 students will participate in a lesson prior to each WSI so they can practice strategies for completing the different tasks.
- ⇒ Grade 10 teachers will determine when the students will participate in the lesson.
- ⇒ Dates for the OSSLT Lessons are:

Period 1 = September 20, 24, 26 or October 2 Period 2 = October 16, 18, 22 or 24 Period 3 = November 11, 13, 18, 20 or 22 Period 4 = December 2, 4, 6, or 10

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Aquatic Leadership Program – Fall 2019

Be certified as a lifeguard ready for employment

Program Information:

Effective September 2019, the Aquatic Leadership Program will be offered in partnership between the York Region District School Board, Continuing Education and the City of Markham, the Town of Aurora and the City of Vaughan. The program uses a blended learning format consisting of pool instruction, face-to-face instruction and on-line learning to deliver Ministry of Education credits and Swim, Lifeguarding and Instructor Certifications.

Part 1: City of Markham and Town of Aurora

Upon completion, successful students may earn the following courses and certifications:

- Secondary School Grade 10 Credit Healthy Living and Aquatic Activities PAQ201
- Bronze Cross (National Lifeguard Certification)
- Bronze Medallion (National Lifeguard Certification)
- Standard First Aid with CPR C

Part 2: City of Vaughan

Upon completion, successful students may earn the following courses and certifications:

- Secondary School Grade 12 Credit Recreation and Healthy Active Living Leadership PLF4M
- Lifesaving Society National Lifeguard Certification
- Lifesaving Society Swim and Lifesaving Instructor

Students must pass the final exam for each aquatic course including the in-water examinations in order to receive their Swim, Lifeguarding and Swim and Lifesaving instructor qualifications. Credits and aquatic certifications may be granted independently.
