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	Ms. Robyn Papoff, guest speaker from George Brown College, gave a very informative presentation on postsecondary scholarships, grants, awards, loans, and OSAP. Key points: -The average student loan debt is \$27,000 and takes 10 years to repay - Types of financial aid available are: Scholarship, Grants, Awards and Loans -Example: in 2019 George Brown disbursed \$7.9 mil in scholarships, grants and awards to 6,000 students and around \$150 mil in OSAP grants and loans for 14,500 students -From \$177 mil available in Canada, each year, \$5mil goes unclaimed -Statistics show that 64% of students received a financial award from their institution and 33% of those said that they would not have been able to attend school without this financial assistance -Check out the ontariocollege.ca site to find information -Helpful tips to prepare for scholarship applications: Start early- collect reference letters, make your cover letters- start as early as grade 10,11 Set aside 1-2 hours per week when preparing for the applications -Meet the applications deadlines Proof read your work before submission Apply to more than one scholarship- Sometime the smaller amount of money has smaller amount of applicants-For some you may be the only one that applied -OSAP is financial program funded by the federal (60-70% and provincial governments(30-40%) Check out <u>www.osap.ca</u> for application information Helpful tips: Apply as soon as you can- process may take 6-8 weeks Manage your money wisely – Do not overspend – Work part time if you can (53% of students work while going to school) Q: What is the parent income max for students to receive OSAP help A: A total of \$110,000 will allow \$0,000 in grants and around \$,400 in loan A total of \$110,000 will allow \$3,000 in grants and higher in loan Please see below a list of websites that could be useful.
