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School Drop Off and Safety - *Thank you to all families who supported our efforts to keep our students safe while arriving at school.* In an effort to promote school zone safety and student health and well-being, students are strongly encouraged to consider walking, cycling or taking public transit. There are many benefits to using sustainable modes of travel including:

- Improves student academic performance by making students more alert and better prepared to learn
- Improves both physical and mental health
- Reduces traffic congestion and improves safety for everyone on school property and around the school community
- Improves air quality
- Promotes lifelong habits that foster independence and active lifestyles

We understand that walking, cycling or taking public transit is not always a viable option. If you need to drive your student, please consider using the schools designated pick-up and drop-off area, or park a few blocks away and have your student walk to school. Be sure to obey all posted signage and pavement markings.

Please do not drop off your student on Major Mackenzie Drive West in front of Tommy Douglas SS. Stopping is strictly prohibited and may result in heavy fines. The real penalty for not obeying traffic regulations is that you may jeopardize the safety of pedestrians and other road users. School Zone Safety is a shared responsibility. If we all work together we can create an environment that is pedestrian friendly for all. We all have a part to play!

School buses use the front parking lot. Help us keep our students safe by using the parking lot North of the school (located near the back fields). The South Entrance and Parking lot is for staff parking and BUSES only. Do not drop off your children in this parking lot and please do not make U-turns in this parking lot nor on the street.

Final Assessments - January 26th to February 1st. As of the 2022-23 school year, the Ministry of Education requires we resume the policy on final evaluations. For Grades 9 to 12, a final grade (percentage mark) is recorded for every course. Final grades will be determined as follows: Seventy percent of the grade will be based on evaluation conducted throughout the course and thirty percent of the grade will be based on a final evaluation administered at or towards the end of the course. This evaluation will be based on evidence from one or a combination of the following: an examination, a performance, an essay, and/or another method of evaluation suitable to the course content. The final evaluation allows the student an opportunity to demonstrate comprehensive achievement of the overall expectations for the course. Students are expected to be present for their final evaluation as such this is not a good time for absences for family vacations. Please plan accordingly.

Learning in December and January -- We would like to commend our students on their diligent efforts since the start of the school year, especially returning from an irregular experience. December and January, with many additional items on a students' agenda, tends to demand more of their diligence and commitment to achievement. Let's all support their efforts and well-being by showing our support. Communicating about upcoming assessments, culminating tasks, time management and organization help students feel reassured and supported. We ask that we all take the moment to ask our students/children about their learning and responsibilities for the upcoming months. 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Cell Phone Policy and Reminders– We are asking parents and guardians to help us remind your child of the cell phone policy at school. Our goal is to support academic learning and at times, cell phones are distracting and often the reason students get involved in serious student behavior. Please review the Board policy that can be found in our 'Guide to the School Year' with your child.

Board Policy- Pg. 55 of Guide to the School Year-*At a minimum cell phones and other personal communication devices must be turned off and kept out of sight during all instructional periods, unless you have clear permission from the principal or the classroom teacher.*

Every Student Counts Survey -- We will be inviting all students in Grades 4-12 and students in Grades K-3 to participate in the 2022-23 Every Student Counts Survey in the Spring of 2023. Surveys will be available online and will take approximately 20 minutes to complete.

You and your child should have received a letter from the Board notifying them that the survey will be taking place. The surveys will provide the Board and our schools with valuable information about the learning experiences of students and families this year that are used to inform Board and school planning and to support student achievement and well-being.

Students in Grades 4-12 will be given class time to complete the survey at schools. Students in Grades K-3 are encouraged to complete the survey at home with their family. Families who do not want their child(ren) to be sent an invitation to participate in the survey will be given a chance to opt their child out of receiving the survey in the new calendar year.

As our first partners in education, we value input from families and encourage parents/guardians to complete the survey. The information provided will be confidential and kept in strict accordance with all relevant legislation.
