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HAPPENING NOW - REGISTRATION FOR THE AFTER SCHOOL LITERACY PROGRAM - Writing the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test? It's never too early to start to prepare!

There will be an After School Literacy Program offered at TDSS during semester 2. The After School Literacy program consists of ten (10) one-hour-and-half (1.5) sessions.

The semester 2 sessions will run on Tuesday and Thursdays from 2:45 pm - 4:25 pm starting Tuesday, February 20th.

Students must attend all 10 sessions.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Celebration of Black History Month has been a part of Canadian society since the 1950s. Lieutenant Governor Hal Jackman declared February as Black History Month in Ontario in 1993, and in 1995, the Honorable Jean Augustine made the same declaration in the House of Parliament in Ottawa.

These declarations set the stage for acknowledging the contributions of Black people of African Heritage to the cultural, economic, political and social fabric of Canada dating back to the early 1600s. They have also increased our awareness that people of African and Caribbean Heritage are an integral part of Canadian history.

During the month of February, we deliberately reflect upon the legacy of African history in all its diversity, and we join all Canadians in celebrating Black History Month. During this month we are able to appreciate the significance of African people in world history by centering people of African, Caribbean, and Canadian heritage, famous and not so famous, who have influenced the nation and the world through their ideas, words and actions.

COURSE SELECTION

Course selection for the 2024-2025 academic year is fast approaching. Guidance will be visiting classrooms Thursday and Friday of next week to share important information regarding pathway planning and the course selection process. Course selection will open Thursday February 15th at 9 a.m. and close Friday February 23rd at 4:00 p.m. Please note that when completing course selection, you will be prompted to include your email for course selection verification. You will receive an instant email from MyBlue Print asking you to either approve or reject the courses selected. It is essential that you respond to this email to ensure that your child's course selection is complete.

Grade 12 Student Timetables

Admin will not consider part-time status (less than 3 courses) for grade 12 students. Students that decide to take private school courses, night school courses or any other course outside of day school will still be required to maintain 3 courses at TDSS.

ATTENTION GRADUATES!!!

Graduation from high school is a milestone reserved for those who have met the criteria. You are eligible to participate in this year's ceremony and commence with your classmates if you have successfully achieved the criteria below:

- You must have obtained 26 credits by the end of Semester 1 towards the requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma
- You must have completed your forty (40) hours of volunteer work by May 3, 2024
- You must have passed the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to report any credits that you have earned at night school, summer school or through private school to the guidance office **by May 2, 2024.** If you do not meet all three criteria listed above, you may not be eligible to take part in this year's graduation ceremony and you may be considered as part of next year's graduating class.

Our Graduation Ceremony will be held at Paramount Eventspace, 222 Rowntree Dairy Rd., Woodbridge, ON L4L 9T2.

Please go to our school cash online to complete the purchase of the Graduation package. This package includes your gown, cap, tassel and **two guest tickets**. There will be no substitutions for the gown package.

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
WASHROOM HALL PASS:

We will be meeting with all students this coming Tuesday and Wednesday for our mid-year Caring and Safe Schools assembly. At this assembly we will be discussing washroom usage and safety for all students. We will be reminding all students that there is NO loitering allowed in the washrooms and that vaping is both illegal and harmful to them.

School staff will continue to monitor washrooms and move students along that are 'waiting for friends' or sitting on the floors visiting or eating (yes, students choose to eat on the washroom floors). We continue to hear from students that they feel unsafe in the washrooms. The best way we can improve safety is to ensure that students are not gathering and loitering in the washrooms. We have asked teachers to ensure that no more than 1 student is leaving their classroom at any one time and to follow-up with students that have been out of their classroom for lengthy amounts of time. Hall passes were implemented this year as we have been experiencing issues in certain washrooms with vandalism and inappropriate use of facilities. Replacing stall doors takes time which may impact access to affected areas for a period of time. Please reinforce this messaging with your children at home to support our safe school environment



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


SCHOOL SAFETY - Student Drop Off and Pick Up


