Friday, many students and staff participated in honouring the children who never returned home to their Indigenous communities, the Survivors of residential schools, and the families of these children. Commemorating the tragic and painful history, as well as the ongoing impact of residential schools, is essential to the reconciliation process. Orange Shirt Day promotes "Every Child Matters". We wear an Orange Shirt to say we are listening to the stories of survivors and their communities, and remembering those who did not survive.

#### School News and Information

**School Drop Off and Safety** - In an effort to promote school zone safety and student health and well-being, students are strongly encouraged to consider walking, cycling or taking public transit. There are many benefits to using sustainable modes of travel including:

- Improves student academic performance by making students more alert and better prepared to learn
- Improves both physical and mental health
- Reduces traffic congestion and improves safety for everyone on school property and around the school community
- Improves air quality
- Promotes life-long habits that foster independence and active lifestyles

We understand that walking, cycling or taking public transit is not always a viable option. If you need to drive your student, please consider using the schools designated pick-up and drop-off area, or park a few blocks away and have your student walk to school. Be sure to obey all posted signage and pavement markings.

Please <u>do not</u> drop off your student on Major Mackenzie Drive West in front of Tommy Douglas SS. Stopping is strictly prohibited and may result in heavy fines. The real penalty for not obeying traffic regulations is that you may jeopardize the safety of pedestrians and other road users.

School Zone Safety is a shared responsibility. If we all work together we can create an environment that is pedestrian friendly for all. We all have a part to play!

Thank you for working with us to help protect the safety of our students and school zone.

Social Media Challenges and the Impact on TDSS -- There are alarming and dangerous challenges circulating on social media, namely *Tiktok*. **Safety Week** - As part of our Safety Week Activities, we held a fire drill on Friday and will be holding a lock down drill this week.

**Cafeteria Services** - Cafeteria services were scheduled to resume later this month, however at this time a firm date has not been set.

**Student Dress Code** - The York Region District School Board regularly engages in reviewing its policies. Currently, the Board of Trustees has identified a need to review Policy #672 Student Leadership and Voice and Policy #635 Student Dress Code. As part of the review process The YRDSB consults extensively with students, staff and community members. We encourage you to review this <u>slide deck</u> to build some context around Student leadership in our Board and fill out the surveys to provide your feedback. We thank you for your participation and your voice in ensuring our policies are reflective of our community of learners. Participation in the survey is completely voluntary, anonymous, and confidential. Your input will be considered and used to help inform revisions to the policies.

**Responding to World Events** - Families may wish to reference YRDSB's <u>tips for families</u>, when navigating discussions with their children about the current world events in which countries are dealing with significant and potentially traumatic events.

**School Council and School Council Nomination** -- Council nominations are still open. Please complete the form at the end of this newsletter if you wish to nominate a candidate or declare your own candidacy. Return the form to the main office or to the school email account prior to the next meeting. Voting will take place at our next council meeting. The available positions are Chair, co-chair, secretary, treasurer and member at large. The remaining council meeting dates are: November 16th, January 11th, February 8th, and May 10th.

Caring and Safe Schools Information for Families -- During last week's Caring and Safe Schools Assemblies students listened attentively to messages about their role in creating a caring, safe and inclusive environment. You may want to ask your child about the topics they learned about and what was discussed. Topics covered included:





#### School News and Information

#### Inappropriate Behaviour

Students are learning about about racism, discrimination and bullying and this learning will continue through the school year. Instances of racism, discrimination and bullying, are not acceptable and are addressed through progressive discipline. Students also need to know about safe behaviours in schools including what not to bring to school such as peanut products, vape products, weapons including replicas.

#### **Reporting Behaviour**

- Standing up for one another and reporting when something does not feel safe is part of a caring and safe school environment. Students should report incidents that make them or others feel unsafe or uncomforable including acts of racism, discrimination and bullying. Students can report incidents by:
- o Telling a caring adult
- o Using the YRDSB's "Report It Button" (located on our school website) YRDSB's online Report It button allows students and families to share information about inappropriate behaviour and/or incidents of hate or discrimination. Please see this video for additional information.

#### **Student Discipline**

We use a progressive discipline approach for inappropriate behaviour. This means we consider a range of options to determine the most appropriate response to each situation to help students learn from their choices. In some cases, suspension or expulsion may be necessary. The Ontario Education Act and the Board's Caring and Safe Schools Policy (found on the Board's Caring and Safe School Page) outline the situations in which suspension and expulsion must be considered. These infractions are also outlined in the Guide to the School Year. When inappropriate behaviour occurs, information will be shared with the victim and parents/guardians of the victim to the extent that legislation allows.

#### **Tobacco/Alcohol/Drug-Free Environment**

The use of tobacco, electronic products (such as vaping, electronic cigarettes and related products) and/or student possession of alcohol/illegal and restricted drugs, including cannabis, are prohibited on school property or within 20 metres of school boundaries. This is in compliance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act, which is enforced locally by York Region Community and Health Services. A progressive form of discipline, including suspension from school and fines (up to \$5,000) may apply. In accordance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act (SFOA), exceptions are made for the traditional use of tobacco that forms part of Indigenous culture and spirituality.

#### **Mental Health**

We want to stress with students the importance of connection as we return to school. Students are learning about who they can talk to if they need support. Positive mental health is closely tied to a sense of identity and safety for each individual. As such, mental health initiatives are aligned with equity and safety in mind which includes culturally specific supports. YRDSB student mental health services are delivered by Board social work and psychology staff. These services are accessible through the school principal. Mental health resources for families are also available on the Board website.

#### Online Safety and Appropriate Use of Technology

Students are reminded about the Appropriate Use of Technology agreement, including the importance of using respectful language and making positive choices when using electronic communications and social media tools. Students are reminded that threats and comments made online are taken seriously and may have serious consequences, including potential criminal charges. Where there are concerns for the safety of students, staff, community members or Board property, the school board works with York Regional Police and appropriate actions are taken. The safety and well-being of students remains our top priority.
