Exams and Culminating Assessments

Please Note that the first day of grade 12 exams will be on June 20

DO NOT make plans for travel, appointments, etc. during the exam period (June 20-27) students are required to write ALL exams at the scheduled time. Failure to report for an examination may result in a mark of "0". If a student is absent from an exam for medical reasons, documentation is required. Illness or emergencies will be dealt with on a case by case basis. Google Takeout for Students that are Graduating or Leaving YRDSB

All retiring students from York Region District School Board - whether they are graduating or moving school boards - have the opportunity to download their Google Workspace for Education files as found in their Google Drive. Once a student leaves our board their access to their GAPPS account disappears.

Please follow the following steps to exhort your data and documents:

- 1. Visit Google Takeout and login with your YRDSB Google Account.
- 2. Select the Google Apps and Services from which you want to export your data and documents, and select the option to receive the file as a download via email (depending on the size of your Google account, this could take several hours). Use the .zip file option.
- 3. Once the Google Takeout email arrives, use the links to download your archived data and documents to your chosen location (e.g. personal computer, USB/external drive and/or personal Google Drive).
- 4. You can "unzip" the archives and then upload the data and documents to a personal Google Account or use the files and documents in Microsoft Office or other applications.

Students have been reminded all week through morning announcements to take home items from their lockers. There will be one final opportunity to empty their lockers on Monday during period 1. It could be a good idea for students to bring bags to carry their belongings in. All items that are not removed from lockers or from our Lost and Found by June 29th will be donated/disposed.


