



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O.S.S. D. Ministry of Education Diploma Requirements

18 compulsory credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

4	credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
3	credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
2	credits in science
1	credit in Canadian history
1	credit in Canadian geography
1	credit in the arts
1	credit in health and physical education
1	credit in French as a second language
0.5	credit in career studies
0.5	credit in civics

In addition, students must complete:

✓	12 optional credits†
✓	40 hours of community involvement activities
✓	the provincial literacy requirement

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:

* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

** In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

*** A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

† The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.


Online Learning Graduation Requirement

Starting during the 2022-23 school year, students may choose to earn at least two online learning credits towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. **These courses are completely asynchronous, meaning there is no teacher instruction.** Students can opt out of taking online learning classes during the course selection process on MyBlue Print. 


Students Receiving Special Education Supports





45%

of students in 2018 indicated that they **rarely or never talk about their feelings or problems with a parent.** **24% only do so sometimes.**



52%- 2016 never or rarely, 25% sometimes

Reasons why our students do not talk with their parents about their feelings or problems...

- **parents would not understand**
- **don't want to stress parents out**
- **feel embarrassed/uncomfortable**
- **parents would not know how to help**
- **feelings would not be taken seriously**
- **family does not talk about their feelings/problems**
