3. Principal's Report

Staffing

A council member voiced concern over too many students in Grade 4 and up. At Trillium Woods PS, there are currently Grade 4 classes with 30 students. This is a result of non existent class caps after Grade 4. Mr Taha explained the yearly enrollment projections: The School Board Planning Department gives projection numbers to the principal who will then create a chart keeping in mind all the different rules, e.g. class cap sizes. The principal will then ask for a certain number of teachers and organization of the school. The proposed organization is approved by the end of February (this process is different this year as the Board is waiting to see what the Ministry is going to do in regards to class sizes and full day Kindergarten), with a possible reorganization in October. The reorganization is due to unforeseen enrollment and can lead to a high number of students per class which has a negative impact on our children's education.
