### **Attendance**

If you receive notification that your child has been marked absent and you believe this to be incorrect, please have your child ask the teacher to notify the office to make the correction. All attendance corrections must be verified by the classroom teacher.

Please Note: Parents/guardians should call/email in absences for students who are experiencing symptoms and are not able to attend classes.

Students who are experiencing symptoms and/or have COVID may be given temporary access to their virtual classes when reported by a parent/guardian to the school. Face to face learners should not join virtual classes without school notification; those that do will be marked absent by their teacher.

Our ceremony is being held at the school in our gym. Graduates can confirm their attendance at our ceremony by completing this <u>Graduation Form</u>. Students and families are strongly encouraged to <u>self-screen</u> prior to attending the ceremony, as well as wear masks throughout the evening.


We are looking forward to celebrating our graduating class of 2022!

#### \*\*Reminder Graduation Tickets

If you are planning on attending our graduation ceremony on June 28 and HAVE NOT picked up your tickets. Please do so, in the main office by the end of the day on WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15, Any unclaimed tickets will become available to families through a lottery system. More details to follow.

#### Self-Screening

All students are required to complete the <u>COVID daily screening</u> prior to entering the building. The screening tool will out-line if/when you can come/return to work and duration of isolation or self-monitoring requirements. Individuals experiencing one or more common symptoms, or two or more other symptoms are presumed to have COVID-19 and must isolate (regardless of vaccination status)



#### **Textbook Returns**

During the summer, YRDSB continues to offer credit and non-credit summer school program opportunities for elementary, secondary and adult students. Registration is now open for the following programs:


