Attendance

If you receive notification that your child has been marked absent and you believe this to be incorrect, please have your child ask the teacher to notify the office to make the correction. All attendance corrections must be verified by the classroom teacher.

Please Note: Parents/guardians should call/email in absences for students who are experiencing symptoms and are not able to attend classes.

Students who are experiencing symptoms and/or have COVID may be given <u>temporary</u> access to their virtual classes when reported by a parent/guardian to the school. Face to face learners <u>should not</u> join virtual classes without school notification; those that do <u>will be marked absent by their teacher</u>.


If you haven't already paid your \$40.00 graduation fee, please be sure to visit <u>SchoolCashOnline</u> to make your payment.

Students and families are strongly encouraged to <u>self-screen</u> prior to attending the ceremony, as well as wear masks throughout the evening.

Self-Screening:

All students are required to complete the <u>COVID daily screening</u> prior to entering the building. The screening tool will out-line if/when you can come/return to work and duration of isolation or self-monitoring requirements. Individuals experiencing one or more common symptoms, or two or more other symptoms are presumed to have COVID-19 and must isolate (regardless of vaccination status)
