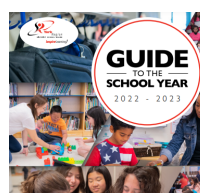

We are fortunate this year to have the MOBYSS bus visit our school twice/month on Wednesdays. MOBYSS is Ontario's first mobile walk-in clinic for youth that provides primary care and mental health care to individuals between the ages of 12 and 25. Their services are completely free of charge, anonymous, and do not require a health card. The MOBYSS team includes a Nurse Practitioner, Youth Mental Health Worker, and Peer Support Specialist.

ASCENDING SISTERS+

Ascending Sisters+ serves as a mentorship program that connects Black girls and non-binary students in grades 7 to 10 with Black YRDSB staff in alignment with the [YRDSB Dismantling Anti-Black Racism Strategy](#). Programming will include: leadership training, career exploration, guest speakers, connections to affirming community initiatives, connections to healing and well-being activities.

Priorities of the program :

- An affirming space where we can learn more about our shared history and identity.
- An opportunity to build a collective voice for Black girls
- Build self confidence and self-esteem for students to be their best selves and future leaders.
- Developing knowledge of post-secondary education and potential career pathways, strengthening communication and advocacy skills.
- Learning strategies that support one's mental health and provide wellness.

Meetings will take place virtually during the school day and students will be excused from their regular classes and programming in order to participate.
