

Google Takeout for Graduating Students

Student access to their Google Workspace for Education account will end upon graduation. Students are reminded to move their files and documents before they leave the school board.

**Due to the size of some Drives and the potential time to create the zip file, it is recommended that students and staff not use a public/school computer to complete this process.



Visit Google Takeout and login with your YRDSB Google Account.

- 1. Select the Google Apps and Services from which you want to export your data and documents, and select the option to receive the file as a download via email (depending on the size of your Google account, this could take several hours). Use the .zip file option.
- 2. Once the Google Takeout email arrives, use the links to download your archived data and documents to your chosen location (e.g. personal computer, USB/external drive and/or personal Google Drive).
- 3. You can "unzip" the archives and then upload the data and documents to a personal Google Account or use the files and documents in Microsoft Office or other application

University Pathways Program for Black Students

The University Pathways Program is a collaboration between three Canadian business schools --lvey Business School at Western University, Schulich School of Business at York University, and
Smith School of Business at Queen's University. It is designed to support self-identified Black
students in their post-secondary academic journeys, as a way to address the significant
under-representation of Black students in Canadian university enrolment, including in business
schools. The first cohort of the program started in January 2023 with 55 students from across the
Greater Toronto Area (GTA).



Some key facts:

- The program is no-cost to participants;
- Mentoring by current Black university students is a key element;
- Enrollment is by student application and approval. Applications for the fall 2023 start will open at the end of May;
- Students begin the program while in grade 11;
- Content includes insights on the university experience from current Black undergraduate students, and learning about prerequisites and requirements for programs so high school students have the time, experiential learning opportunities, and support networks to prepare for post-secondary education;
- The program is primarily delivered online via Zoom sessions outside of school hours. There are occasional in-person activities that provide a chance to visit the campuses of participating universities;
- The Program offers significant financial support options to reduce the financial barrier to post-secondary education;
- The program is currently only available to Black students based in the GTA.
